10 OF THE ARKANSAS FIRE PROTECTION LICENSING BOARD; TO
11 DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
22

23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 20-22-610(b), concerning fees of the
24 Arkansas Fire Protection Licensing Board, is amended to add two (2)
25 additional subdivisions to read as follows:

26 (10) A fee not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) shall be paid
27 for:

28 (A) The duplication of a:

29 (i) Certificate of registration;

30 (ii) Individual license;

31 (iii) Class A hydrostatic testing certificate;

32 (iv) Class B hydrostatic testing certificate; and

33 (v) Apprentice permit; or

34 (B) The issuance of a new document under subdivision
35 (b)(10)(A) of this section if a change in the information on the document
36 under subdivision (b)(10)(A) of this section requires the issuance of a new



1 document.

2 (11) A firm with more than one (1) physical location, including
3 without limitation one (1) or more branch offices, shall pay a fee not to
4 exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) for an additional certificate of registration
5 for each additional location.

7 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
8 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that under § 25-15-105, the
9 authority of the Arkansas Fire Protection Licensing Board to charge certain
10 fees currently collected by the board will expire on July 1, 2013, and that
11 this act is necessary to allow the board to continue to collect the revenues
12 it currently receives and to allow the board to maintain its current level of
13 operation. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being
14 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
15 become effective on July 1, 2013.
