The operator of an all-terrain vehicle overtaking another vehicle proceeding in the same direction shall pass at a safe distance to the left until safely clear of the overtaken vehicle. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to This subsection shall not prohibit an operator of an all-terrain vehicle from overtaking and passing upon the right another vehicle which that is making or about to make a left turn if the overtaking and passing is
