 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HUMAN
 SERVICES RENOVATION FUND. Department of Human Services Renovation Fund.

(a) There is established on the books of the Treasurer of State, Auditor
of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as the
Department of Human Services Renovation Fund.

(b) This fund shall be used for constructing, acquiring, renovating,
maintaining, repairing, and equipping facilities of the Department of Human
Services and for paying disallowances by the federal government.

19 (c) The fund shall consist of:

(1) Federal reimbursement received by the Department of Human Services anddeposited in the various fund accounts of the department; and

22 (2) General revenues transferred from the Division of Youth Services, the 23 Division of Behavioral Health, and the Division of Developmental Disabilities 24 Services for the purposes of repairing, renovating, equipping, acquiring and 25 constructing Department of Human Services facilities with an annual maximum 26 of five million dollars (\$5,000,000). The projects for which these transfers 27 are authorized must be projects which were unanticipated during the preceding 28 regular session of the Arkansas General Assembly and must be projects which, 29 if not carried out in the interim period between regular sessions of the Arkansas General Assembly would cause greater harm to the facilities, clients 30 31 or programs of the Department of Human Services than to wait until the next 32 regular session.

33 (3) Other non-general revenue funds as may be available within the Department34 of Human Services that can be used for the purposes of this fund.

35 (d)(1) At the request of the Director of the Department of Human Services,36 and upon certification of the availability of such funds, the Chief Fiscal

Officer of the State shall initiate the necessary transfer documents to
 reflect the transfer on the books of record of the Treasurer of State, the

Auditor of State, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and the Departmentof Human Services.

5 (2) The Director of the Department of Human Services shall submit any
6 transfer plan to and must receive approval of the plan from the Chief Fiscal
7 Officer of the State, the Governor and the Arkansas Legislative Council prior
8 to the effective date of the transfer.

9 (e) Provided, that any non-general revenue funding that may remain in the 10 fund at the end of any fiscal year shall be carried over into the next fiscal 11 year and all obligated general revenue funding that may remain in the fund at 12 the end of any fiscal year shall be carried over into the next fiscal year to 13 satisfy such legal and contractual obligations that have been entered into 14 prior to the end of the fiscal year.

15 (f) Determining the amount of funds appropriated to a state agency is the 16 prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by 17 delineating specific line items and by identifying the appropriation and 18 funding attached to that line item. The General Assembly has determined that 19 the Department of Human Services could be operated more efficiently if some 20 flexibility is given to that agency. That flexibility is being accomplished 21 by providing transfer authority in subsection (d) of this section, and since 22 the General Assembly has granted the agency broad powers under the transfer 23 authority concept, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General 24 Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization of the transfer authority by 25 requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council in the utilization of 26 this transfer authority. Therefore, the requirement of approval by the 27 Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section. If the 28 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled unconstitutional 29 by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void. 30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2014 31 2015 through June 30, 2015 2016.

33 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 35 AUTHORITY. The Director of the Department of Human Services shall have 36 transfer authority provided by the following:

HB1151

(a) DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES RENOVATION FUND. The Director of the
 Department of Human Services is authorized to request fund transfers
 according to the provisions established by Arkansas Code Ann. 19-5-1020,
 Department of Human Services Renovation Fund, as amended herein; and

5 (b) MATCH TRANSFER. The Director of the Department of Human Services, 6 with the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, is authorized to 7 effect inter-agency and inter-divisional fund transfers for the purpose of 8 providing the State's matching share for payments made to that Division or 9 Office or its service providers for services eligible for federal 10 reimbursement under programs administered by the Department of Human 11 Services. The Department of Human Services shall report to the Legislative 12 Council or Joint Budget Committee on a quarterly basis all fund transfers 13 made in accordance with the authority granted by this section; and

14 (c) YOUTH SERVICES - HOUSING AND SEPARATION APPROPRIATION PROVISIONS. The 15 Division of Youth Services (DYS) is authorized to fulfill its responsibility 16 to house offenders between the ages of 18 and 21 and to separate juvenile 17 offenders by age and seriousness of offense by either employing additional 18 state employees and providing the corresponding operating expenses or 19 entering into professional services contracts. If the Division of Youth 20 Services determines that the Division needs to employ state employees to 21 fulfill the housing and separation requirements, they may transfer up to the 22 total amount appropriated for the DYS - Residential Services Program 23 appropriation to the appropriate DYS appropriation and line items, upon 24 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and prior review by the 25 Legislative Council; and

26 (d) REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES: (1) The Department of Human Services (DHS) 27 provides hundreds of different services to over 1 million Arkansans. The 28 specific mix of service needs and the funding and staffing required to 29 provide them can vary significantly based on many factors, including natural 30 disasters, changing federal mandates and funding sources, demographic shifts, 31 fluctuating court-ordered services, social trends, and job market variations 32 such as nursing shortages. The impact of these factors through the course of 33 any fiscal year make it very difficult for the Department to accurately 34 predict the exact needs for funding, appropriation and positions in each of 35 its over 100 different appropriations. To ensure that it can respond quickly 36 to changing client needs and make the most effective use of the resources

1 allocated to it, the Department of Human Services shall be authorized to 2 utilize the reallocation of resource authority to make the proper adjustments to the budgets within the Department. Therefore, upon determination by the 3 4 Director of the Department of Human Services that a reallocation of resources 5 within the department is necessary for the efficient and effective operation 6 of the department, the director, with approval of the Governor, shall have 7 the authority to request, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, a 8 transfer of positions, appropriations, line item appropriations, and funds 9 within or between existing and newly created divisions, offices, sections, or 10 units of the department. Provided, however, that no transfer of funds or 11 appropriation that provides direct support or matching support for the 12 Arkansas Medicaid Program shall be made to any other fund account or 13 appropriation that does not directly support the Arkansas Medicaid Program. 14 Further, no positions, funds, or appropriation authorized during the budget 15 process for the Division of Children and Family Services compliance with 16 initiatives established under the Angela R. consent decree shall be 17 transferred to any other division. Nothing in this provision is intended to 18 prevent the one-time transfers of savings in any other program to the 19 Arkansas Medicaid Program, with the exception of the provisions previously cited for the Division of Children and Family Services - Angela R. consent 20 21 decree. The Division of Developmental Disabilities - Grants to Community 22 Providers line item of the Developmental Disabilities Services - Grants-in-23 Aid appropriation may not be decreased. The appropriation, funding, and 24 positions provided for the five Human Development Centers shall remain at a 25 level sufficient to ensure quality care for the Centers' residents. The 26 exemptions provided in this subsection whereby certain DHS Programs and 27 Divisions are protected from appropriation, fund, or position transfers are 28 applicable only to the reallocation or transfer authority granted herein, and 29 not by any reductions which are applicable to all state programs.

The Director of the Department of Human Services shall submit any requests for transfers to and must receive approval of the requests for transfers from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the Governor, and the Arkansas Legislative Council prior to the effective date of the transfers. Provided, however, that the Department of Human Services shall be limited to submitting no more than two reallocation of resources transfer requests during any fiscal year. In each Departmental request no single division will request

2 authority for unforeseen purposes shall further be limited to no more than 5%

3 of the total appropriation, funding, and positions authorized for the

4 Department. Reallocation of resources transfers may include multiple items

5 but shall be limited to the following purposes:

6 i). Medicaid Program

7 ii). Facilities and institutions costs, including operational expenses and8 construction/renovation/equipping expenses

9 iii). Departmental grants and contracts

10 iv). Court ordered settlements and payments

11 v). Payment of administrative expenses, including but not limited to, 12 overtime and other costs of personnel for critical services or functions 13 necessary to carry out the mission of the agency

14 vi). Restructuring efforts as deemed necessary to comply with new and/or 15 unanticipated federal or state mandates

16 vii). Redirecting internal resources, both direct and/or indirect, to meet
17 client needs and services

18 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 19 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 20 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 21 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 22 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 23 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has 24 determined that the Department of Human Services may operate more efficiently 25 if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Human Services 26 authorizing broad powers under the Reallocation of Resources provisions 27 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General 28 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative 29 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The 30 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 31 is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by 32 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional 33 by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void. 34 (2) If it is determined that the requested reallocation of resources

35 transfers should be made, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall then 36 initiate the necessary transfer documents to reflect the transfers upon the

1 fiscal records of the Treasurer of State, the Auditor of State, the Chief 2 Fiscal Officer of the State, and the Department of Human Services. In addition, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, together with the Co-3 4 Chairpersons of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, may 5 approve, on an emergency basis, requests for utilization of this Section 6 without prior approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council, with any such 7 actions reported at the next meeting of the Arkansas Legislative Council. 8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2014 9 2015 through June 30, 2015 2016.

11 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. NURSING/DIRECT CARE EDUCATION STIPEND PROGRAM. Special provision for a 13 14 Nursing/Direct Care Education Stipend Program for the Department of Human 15 Services is hereby authorized to pay from State and Federal Funds 16 appropriated in each division Act. This program is for eligible nursing 17 students who are attending accredited nursing institutions to become 18 Registered or Licensed Practical Nurses, as well as Certified Nursing 19 Assistants, Residential Care Assistants, Residential Care Technicians, 20 Residential Care Supervisors and Behavioral Health Aides.

21 The stipend is \$5,000 per person per year. Any student who is awarded and 22 accepts a stipend is under employment commitment to the respective DHS 23 Division and is required to work for that division, in a full-time employee 24 status effective immediately upon graduation. The student employment 25 commitment is equal to the number of years the stipend was awarded and 26 accepted. In the event of Employee/Student default of the employment 27 commitment, the Employee/Student will be considered in breach of contract and 28 repayment of the stipend will be required as specified in the Stipend 29 Contract.

Each division participating in the Education Stipend Program shall
determine on an annual basis, the number of student stipends available.
The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2014
2015 through June 30, 2015 2016.

35 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

1 NURSING/DIRECT CARE RECRUITMENT/RETENTION BONUSES. Special provision to 2 provide Nursing/Direct Care Recruitment and Retention Bonuses for the Department of Human Services is hereby authorized to pay from State and 3 4 Federal funds appropriated for each respective division. Nursing/direct care 5 service recruitment/retention bonuses are in addition to the maximum annual 6 amounts provided in the Regular Salaries Section of the respective Division 7 Act for Registered Nurse, Licensed Practical Nurse, Certified Nursing 8 Assistant, Residential Care Assistant, Residential Care Technician, 9 Residential Care Supervisor and Behavioral Health Aide. New hire nurses must 10 be licensed by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing. The total 11 recruitment/retention bonus payment commitment for eligible nurses shall not 12 exceed \$4,000 per Registered Nurse and \$2,000 per Licensed Practical Nurse 13 and \$1,000 per Certified Nursing Assistant, Residential Care Assistant, 14 Residential Care Technician, Residential Care Supervisor and Behavioral 15 Health Aide. 16 The lump sum bonus payments and employment commitment to the State will be 17 made in partial payments as follows: 18 19 Registered Nurse Classifications 20 \$1,000 after completing 6 months probationary employment 21 \$1,500 after completing 1st year employment 22 \$1,500 after completing 2nd year employment 23 24 Licensed Practical Nurse Classifications 25 \$ 500 after completing 6 months probationary employment 26 \$ 500 after completing 1st year employment \$1,000 after completing 2nd year employment 27 28 29 Certified Nursing Assistant/Residential Care Assistant/Residential Care 30 Technician/Residential Care Supervisor/Behavioral Health Aide 31 Classifications 32 \$ 500 after completing 6 month probationary employment 33 \$ 500 after completing 1st year employment 34 35 Any qualified person hired and offered bonus payment described herein will 36 forfeit the balance of the payments if he/she voluntarily resigns or is

7 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 9 TRANSFER PROVISION - HEALTH CARE INDEPENDENCE PROGRAM TRUST FUND. 10 Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, the entire 11 amount received and retained in the Medicaid Trust Fund from the Pulaski 12 County Circuit Court Case No. CV2007-15345 shall be transferred from the Medicaid Trust Fund to the Health Care Independence Program Trust Fund to be 13 14 used exclusively as authorized by Ark. Code 19-5-1141.

15 <u>The provisions of this section shall be in effect from July 1, 2015</u> 16 <u>through June 30, 2016.</u>

SECTION 21. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 18 19 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 20 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 21 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 22 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 23 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 24 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 25 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 26 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

27

28 SECTION 22. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 29 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 30 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 31 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 32 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 33 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 34 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 35 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 36

1	SECTION 23. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
2	General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
3	the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
4	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2015 is essential to the operation of
5	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
6	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
7	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2015 could work irreparable harm
8	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
9	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
10	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
11	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2015.
