24	military reservation's system of charges or summoned to appear before any

26	(2) A person adversely affected by any administrative		
27	determination as described shall have a right to appeal therefrom to the		
28	appropriate district court where the matter shall be heard de novo.		
29	(b) Persons violating military reservation rules and regulations under		
30	this section while using a motor vehicle not registered with the military		
31	reservation authorities shall be summoned to appear before the appropriate

33	$\frac{(e)}{(b)}$ Notice placed on the motor vehicle shall be sufficient as a

SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the

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1	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the security of military		
2	reservations and enforcement of regulations thereupon are of paramount		
3	importance to the continued safety and security of the State of Arkansas.		
4	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately		
5	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall		
6	become effective on:		
7	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
8	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
9	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
10	bill; or		
11	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
12	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
