2	All applicable regulations and statutes regulating the conduct of
3	police or fire departments or their functions shall apply to a department of

7	(a)(1) The governing body of any city having a population, according
8	to the 1970 Federal Decennial Census, of at least twenty-one thousand
9	(21,000) but less than twenty-four thousand (24,000) may create by ordinance
10	a department of public safety.
11	(2) The department of public safety shall consist of a fire
12	division and a public safety division.

27	officer, after having completed not less than twenty (20) years' combined
28	service as a public safety officer and firefighter.
29	(c) In computing total years of service for retirement, the board of
30	trustees of the policemen's pension and relief fund shall give credit for the
31	time which the public safety officer shall have devoted to full-time duty as
32	a public safety officer and also as a firefighter. However, no public safety
33	officer shall be eligible to receive years of service credit served as a
34	firefighter until he or she has completed a minimum of fifteen (15) years'
35	service as a public safety officer.
