7	17-92-112. Prescriptions for physician assistants.		
8	(a) Pharmacists licensed in the State of Arkansas are hereby		
9	authorized to fill prescriptions in the State of Arkansas for licensed		
10	physician assistants for Schedule III V controlled substances as described :		
11	the Uniform Controlled Substances Act, §§ 5-64-101-5-64-510, and 21 C.F.R.		
12	Part 1300.		
13	(b) Physician assistant-generated prescriptions for controlled		
14	substances must have the physician assistant's name and United States Drug		
15	Enforcement Administration number and the supervising physician's name		
16	communicated either verbally, in writing, or by electronic means. Controlled		
17	substances, prescription medications, and products dispensed by a licensed		
18	pharmacist to a patient per a physician assistant-generated prescription		
19	shall state on the labeling prepared by the pharmacist the physician		
20	assistant's name and "PA" behind the physician assistant's name. Pharmacists		
21	shall carry out the physician assistant's prescriptive request or order in		
22	the same manner as they would for the physician assistant's supervising		
23	physician. All prescriptions and orders issued by a physician assistant shal		
24	also identify his or her supervising physician.

26	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 92, Subchapter 1, is		
27	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
28	17-92-117. Prescriptions for all healthcare professionals.		
29	(a) As used in this section, "healthcare professional" means a person		
30	who is licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized by the laws of this state		
31	to administer health care in the ordinary course of the practice of his or		
32	her profession.		
33	(b) A pharmacist licensed in the State of Arkansas may fill		
34	prescriptions in the State of Arkansas for any healthcare professional who		
35	has prescriptive authority to the extent of that healthcare professional's
