Upon request of the Commissioner, approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, the State Insurance Department may retain an amount above that which is set out in A.C.A. 23-61-710(c) for the purposes of providing funding for the construction and renovation of Department facilities, not to exceed eight million dollars (\$8,000,000) in a single biennium. The amount being requested must be submitted to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State by April 1st of each fiscal year.

The provisions of this section shall expire on June 30,  $\frac{2019}{2020}$ .

SECTION 28. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

2	SECTION 29. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
3	Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
4	contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
5	which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
6	Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
7	manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or

11	SECTION 30. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the

15	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided; with the

18	event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date
19	of this Act beyond July 1, 2019, with the exception that Section 25 and
20	Section 26 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the
21	date of its passage and approval, could work irreparable harm upon the proper
22	administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore,
23	an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
24	immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in
25	full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019; with the exception that
26	Section 25 and Section 26 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from
27	and after the date of its passage and approval.
