Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein,may be carried forward under the following conditions:

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14 SECTION 47. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHAPLAIN 16 HOUSING ALLOWANCE. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical 17 Sciences may designate up to forty-five percent (45%) of the regular gross 18 salary (or stipend) of a minister or other clergy employed as a Chaplain or 19 appointed as a Chaplain Resident, as a housing allowance, to the extent used 20 by the person to rent or provide a home, according to the guidelines of the 21 Internal Revenue Service Code, Section 107 and the Arkansas Code 26-51-22 404(b)(9).

ESTABLISHMENT OF A "GROWTH POOL". (a) The Arkansas Department Division of 3 4 Higher Education shall establish and maintain for the 2020-2021 2021-2022 5 fiscal year a pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary 6 level not to exceed \$307,741. A position established under this section shall 7 not exceed the salary rate of the highest maximum annual salary rate 8 authorized by the General Assembly in the institution's appropriation act. 9 These positions are to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical 10 Sciences in the event that the personal services needs of the University 11 during the 2020-2021 2021-2022 fiscal year exceed the number of positions 12 allocated to the University by the Legislature. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship 13 14 Program Loans and/or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and 15 Scholarship Program Loans and/or Scholarships have the goal of providing 16 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such 17 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for 18 "Medical Loans and Scholarships".

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22 SECTION 53. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CLINICAL 24 EXPANSION AND RESEARCH POOL. (a) In order to address personnel needs emerging 25 from expanding medical research and patient care issues and the necessity of 26 recruiting and retaining qualified medical, research, and related support 27 personnel, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences or its successor 28 is authorized for the 2020-2021 2021-2022 fiscal year a pool of seven hundred 29 (700) "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions. These positions are to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event 30 31 that the personal services needs resulting from unanticipated clinical or 32 research programs that are initiated during the 2020-2021 2021-2022 fiscal year require additional positions, either in title, in classification, or in 33 34 number, that are not authorized or contemplated by the General Assembly in 35 the Regular Salaries - Operations section of this Act.

36 (b) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is authorized to

An employee shall not exceed 128 hours during any seven-day 8 period, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform 9 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the 10 appropriate compensation.

ABUSED 16 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event 17 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas 18 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric 19 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount 20 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven 21 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as 22 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year 23 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to 24 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents 25 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical 26 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide 27 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of 28 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the 29 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services, 30 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts 31 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will 32 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount 33 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for 34 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if 35 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve 36 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars

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(\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of
 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and
 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of
 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of
 Pediatrics.

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SECTION 56. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DHS AND 10 11 UAMS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. The University of Arkansas for Medical 12 Sciences (UAMS) and the Department of Human Services shall enter into a 13 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to determine any reimbursement, 14 administrative charges or fees for the State Olmstead plan or for processing 15 or administration of State match funds charges as reimbursement funding for 16 federal financial participation under the Medicaid's Disproportionate Share 17 (DSH) reimbursement program or any other arrangements or agreements that 18 could benefit UAMS for Fiscal Year 2019 and forward upon prior review of the 19 Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint 20 Budget Committee.

21 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2020
22 <u>2021</u> through June 30, 2021 <u>2022</u>.

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SECTION 57. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 24 25 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 26 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 27 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 28 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 29 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures 30 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this 31 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of 32 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 33

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35 SECTION 58. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General36 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
