Disbursement of funds 18 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 19 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 20 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 21 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 22 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restriction 23 Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where 24 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and 25 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in 26 disbursement of said funds. SECTION 49. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 28 29 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 30

contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

1	<u>SECTION 50. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General</u>
2	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
3	appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
4	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2023, with the exception that Section 27
5	is effective upon passage and approval, is essential to the operation of the
6	agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the
7	event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective
8	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2023, with the exception that Section 27 is
9	effective upon passage and approval, could work irreparable harm upon the
10	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
11	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
12	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
13	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2023 with the
14	exception that Section 27 is effective upon passage and approval.
