34	SECTION 2. DO	NOT CODIFY. <u>Retroactivity.</u>			
35	(a) This act a	pplies retroactively to a contract to wa	ive a jury	<u>trial</u>	
36	entered into before t	he effective date of this act.			

(b) This act applies retroactively to all judicial proceedings in			
which a contract to waive a jury trial is at issue if the judicial proceeding			
is still pending on the effective date of the act.			
SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the			
General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that decisions of the Arkansas			
Supreme Court regarding contractual jury waiver provisions leave parties in			
doubt about the applicability of their contracts; that this uncertainty must			
be resolved immediately; and that this uncertainty may only be resolved			
through the immediate effectiveness of this act. Therefore, an emergency is			
declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the			
preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective			
on:			
(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;			
(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,			
the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the			
bill; or			
(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is			
overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
