17	WHEREAS, on March 5, 1959, there was a fire in a dormitory at the
18	Arkansas Negro Boys Industrial School in Wrightsville, Arkansas; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, the dormitory housed 68 boys and 21 of the boys perished in
21	the fire due to locked doors and the severity of the fire; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, because of both the lack of a fire department in Wrightsville
24	and the need for the Little Rock Fire Department to lay 600' of hose to reach
25	the nearest fire hydrant upon arrival, the entire dormitory was lost in the
26	fire; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, 14 of the 21 deceased boys were buried at the Haven of Rest
29	Cemetery in a mass grave without a marking or headstone; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, helping the effort to remember those who lost their lives to
32	the fire is the 2017 book by Grif Stockley, "Black Boys Burning: The 1959
33 34	Fire at the Arkansas Negro Boys Industrial School"; and
35	WHEREAS, former Senator Irma Hunter Brown, who leads the Friends of the
36	Haven of Rest and is a part of a group that raised funds for the monument.
