Senator Bruce Holland represents Senate District 6, which is comprised of Scott County and parts of Johnson, Logan, Polk and Sebastian Counties. Elected in November 2010, he is serving his first term in the Arkansas Senate.

During the 88th General Assembly, he serves as vice chairman of the Arkansas Legislative Council Peer Review Subcommittee and is a member on Arkansas Legislative Council; Legislative Joint Auditing; ALC-Review; Senate Education; Senate Transportation, Technology and Legislative Affairs; Joint Energy; Joint Advanced Communications and Information Technology; ALC- Higher Education Subcommittee; ALC-Policy Making; Legislative Joint Auditing-Educational Institutions and Academic Facilities Oversight Committee.

Civically, Senator Holland is active with several boards including as a member of the Land O'Lakes Corporation Governance Council, which represents 14 states. He serves in several capacities on the Council both as secretary for the Council and as chairman of policies and resolutions. Additionally, Senator Holland serves on the Van Buren Farmers Co-op, is a member of the Sebastian County Historical Society Board and a member of the Sebastian County Fair Board and Association. He is former chairman of the Farm Service Agency County Committee for Crawford, Scott and Sebastian Counties, former president of the Sebastian County Farm Bureau. He is a member of the National Rifle Association (NRA) and the National Wild Turkey Federation. Professionally, Senator Holland is a cattleman and rancher. He attended the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville and majored in chemical engineering. A native of Sebastian County, he resides in Greenwood, is a member of the Greenwood United Methodist Church and enjoys country music, hunting and bass fishing.
