21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
22

23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 5-14-112 is amended to read as follows:
24 5-14-112. Indecent exposure.

25 (a)(1) A person commits indecent exposure if, with purpose to arouse
26 or gratify the sexual desire of himself or of any other person, he exposes
27 his sex organs:

28 (A) In a public place or public view; or

29 (B) Under circumstances in which he knows his conduct is
30 likely to cause affront or alarm.

31 (2)(A) Indecent exposure is a Class A misdemeanor.

32 (B) Indecent exposure is a Class D felony when committed
33 by anyone incarcerated in the Department of Correction or the Department of
34 Community Punishment.

35 (b)(1) A person commits indecent exposure to a person under the age of
36 twelve (12) years if, with the purpose to arouse or gratify the sexual desire

1 of himself or of any other person he purposefully exposes his sex organs to a
2 person under the age of twelve (12) years.

3 (2) Indecent exposure to a person the age of twelve (12) years
4 and under is a Class D felony.
