22 WHEREAS, Mrs. Nancy Luelf, of Mountain Home, Arkansas, died on  
23 Thursday, February 10, 2005, at the age of forty-seven (47) years; and

25 WHEREAS, Mrs. Luelf was named BPW Professional Woman of the Year in  
26 2002 for her leadership skills and concern for women's issues; and

28 WHEREAS, Mrs. Luelf began her career as a certified flight instructor  
29 and as an investment representative for Merrill Lynch Investments; and

30  
31 WHEREAS, Mrs. Luelf was an advocate for women, especially against  
32 sexual harassment in the workplace; and

34 WHEREAS, Mrs. Luelf served as vice president of the local BPW chapter;  
35 was a longtime member of Mountain Home Rotary Club; was on the advisory  
36 committee for the Hospital Development Foundation of Baxter Regional Medical



1 Center; and was active in the local Republican party; and

3 WHEREAS, Mrs. Luelf began working for Edward Jones in 1999 and received  
4 numerous awards; and

6 WHEREAS, Mrs. Luelf won a statewide BPW Women Mean Business Award in  
7 the category of "Achieving Excellence in the Financial Services Profession";  
8 and

10 WHEREAS, Mrs. Luelf was a longtime member of the Baxter County Airport  
11 Authority; and

13 WHEREAS, Mrs. Luelf was named honorary chair of the local American  
14 Cancer Society's Relay for Life Committee in 2001, shortly after being  
15 diagnosed with ovarian cancer; and

17 WHEREAS, Mrs. Luelf was a member of First United Methodist Church in  
18 Mountain Home, Arkansas; and

20 WHEREAS, Mrs. Luelf is survived by her husband, former State Senator  
21 Stephen Luelf, the owner of American Stitchco Co.; three (3) sons, Ben and  
22 Alex Luelf of the home, and Chad Beshears of Mountain Home, Arkansas; one (1)  
23 daughter, Amy Diede of Greenwood, Arkansas; parents, Myrtle R. and Alton L.  
24 Rogers of Greenwood, Arkansas; five (5) grandchildren; and two (2) sisters,  
25 Cathy Jones of Tulsa, Oklahoma, and Lisa Rogers of Greenwood, Arkansas; and

27 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives of the Eighty-fifth General  
28 Assembly wishes to publicly recognize Mrs. Luelf's contributions to the State  
29 of Arkansas and her local community,
