24 WHEREAS, Mr. Claud Cash, of Trumann, Arkansas, died on March 8, 2004,
25 at the age of sixty-nine (69) years in Jonesboro, Arkansas, where he lived
26 for the past five (5) years; and

28 WHEREAS, Mr. Cash was a pillar in his community and in business before
29 entering politics and became an exceptional leader in the State of Arkansas;
30 and

32 WHEREAS, Mr. Cash served as past presidents of the Trumann Lions Club
33 and MidSouth Farm Equipment Dealers Association; served on the boards of
34 directors for Liberty Bank and St. Bernard's Foundation; received a
35 bachelor's degree from Arkansas State University where he was recognized as a
36 Distinguished Alumnus of the College of Business; and was a member of First



1 Baptist Church in Jonesboro, the University Heights Lions Club, and Trumann
2 Masonic Lodge No. 693; and

4 WHEREAS, Mr. Cash served two (2) terms in the Arkansas House of
5 Representatives where he became the first freshman representative to be
6 elected to the Joint Budget Committee; and served one (1) term in the Senate;
7 and

9 WHEREAS, Mr. Cash was known for his bipartisan leadership, an
10 unwavering dedication to his constituents, and his sharp legislative mind;
11 and

13 WHEREAS, Mr. Cash was a fearless champion for the causes in which he
14 believed though the subject might be unpopular and controversial; and

15

16 WHEREAS, Mr. Cash was trusted by friends and competitors alike, as he
17 always chose the honorable path; and

18

19 WHEREAS, Mr. Cash was preceded in death by his parents, Vernon and
20 Lucille Cash, and two brothers; and

22 WHEREAS, Mr. Cash is survived by his wife, Joan Cash; one son, Greg
23 Cash of Pocahontas, Arkansas; one daughter, Jennifer Linton of Lonoke,
24 Arkansas; one sister, Carol White of Trumann, Arkansas; and five
25 grandchildren; and

27 WHEREAS, the Senate of the Eighty-fifth General Assembly of the State
28 of Arkansas wishes to publicly recognize Mr. Cash's many contributions to the
29 State of Arkansas and his local community,

31 NOW THEREFORE,

32 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
33 STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

35 THAT the Senate recognizes Claud Cash's commitment, hard work,
36 dedication, and years of service to the State of Arkansas and his local

1 community and commends him for his leadership.
