- 3 (4) "Canvassing" means examining and counting the returns of
- 4 votes cast at a public election to determine authenticity;
- 5 (5) "Constitutional officers of this state" means the offices of
- 6 the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General,
- 7 Auditor of State, Treasurer of State, and Commissioner of State Lands;
- 8 (6) "Counting location" means a location selected by the county
- 9 board of election commissioners with respect to all elections for the
- 10 automatic processing or counting, or both, of votes;
- 11 (7) "Designated bearer" means any person who is identified and
- 12 authorized by the applicant to obtain from the county clerk or to deliver to
- 13 the county clerk the applicant's ballot;
- 14 (8) "Election official" or "election officer" means a person who
- 15 is a member of the county board of election commissioners or a person who is
- 16 a poll worker designated by a county board of election commissioners to be an
- 17 election clerk, election judge, or election sheriff;
- 18 (9) "Electronic vote tabulating device" means a device used to
- 19 electronically scan a marked paper ballot for the purposes of tabulation;
- 20 (10) "Fail-safe voting" means the mechanism established under
- 21 the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 that allows voters who have moved

- 32 (13) "Majority party" means that political party in the State of
- 33 Arkansas whose candidates were elected to a majority of the constitutional
- 34 offices of this state in the last preceding general election;
- 35 (14) "Marking device" means any approved device for marking a
- 36 paper ballot with ink or other substances which will enable the votes to be

- 1 tabulated by means of an electronic vote tabulating device;
- 2 (15) "Minority party" means that political party whose
- 3 candidates were elected to less than a majority of the constitutional offices
- 4 of this state in the last preceding general election or the political party
- 5 which polled the second greatest number of votes for the office of Governor
- 6 in the last preceding general election if all of the elected constitutional
- 7 officers of this state are from a single political party;
- 8 (16) "Party certificate" means a written statement or receipt
- 9 signed by the secretary or chair of the county committee or of the state
- 10 committee, as the case may be, of the political party evidencing the name and
- 11 title proposed to be used by the candidate on the ballot, the position the
- 12 candidate seeks, payment of the fees, and filing of the party pledge, if any,
- 13 required by the political party;
- 14 (17)(A) "Political party" means any group of voters which at the
- 15 last preceding general election polled for its candidate for Governor in the
- 16 state or nominees for presidential electors at least three percent (3%) of
- 17 the entire vote cast for the office.
- 18 (B) No group of electors shall assume a name or
- 19 designation which is so similar in the opinion of the Secretary of State to
- 20 that of an existing political party as to confuse or mislead the voters at an
- 21 election.
- 22 (C) When any political party fails to obtain three percent
- 23 (3%) of the total votes cast at an election for the office of Governor or
- 24 nominees for presidential electors, it shall cease to be a political party;
- 25 (18) "Polling site" means a location selected by the county
- 26 board of election commissioners where votes are cast;
- 27 (19) "Precinct" means the geographical boundary lines dividing a
- 28 county, municipality, township, or school district for voting purposes;
- 29 (20) "Primary election" means any election held by a political
- 30 party in the manner provided by law for the purpose of selecting nominees of
- 31 the political party for certification as candidates for election at any
- 32 general or special election in this state;
- 33 (21) "Proof of identity" means a document or identification card
- 34 that:
- 35 (A) Shows the name of the person to whom the document was
- 36 <u>issued;</u>

1	(B) Shows a photograph of the person to whom the document
2	was issued;
3	(C) Contains an expiration date and:
4	(1) Is not expired; or
5	(2) Expired no more than four (4) years before the
6	date of the election in which the person wishes to vote; and

9	(21)(22) "Qualified elector" means a person who holds the
10	qualifications of an elector and who is registered pursuant to Arkansas

12	$\frac{(22)}{(23)}$ "Vacancy in election" means the vacancy in an elective
13	office created by death, resignation, or other good and legal cause, arising
14	prior to election to the office at a general or special election but arising
15	subsequent to the certification of the ballot;
16	$\frac{(23)}{(24)}$ "Vacancy in nomination" means the circumstances in
17	which the person who received the majority of votes at the preferential
18	primary election or general primary election cannot accept the nomination due
19	to death or notifies the party that he or she will not accept the nomination
20	due to serious illness, moving out of the area from which the person was
21	elected as the party's nominee, or filing for another office preceding the
22	final date for certification of nominations;
23	$\frac{(24)}{(25)}$ (A) "Vacancy in office" means the vacancy in an elective
24	office created by death, resignation, or other good and legal cause arising
25	subsequent to election to the office at a general or special election or
26	arising subsequent to taking office and prior to the expiration of the term
27	of office in those circumstances wherein the vacancy must be filled by a
28	special election rather than by appointment.
29	(B) The phrase "vacancy in office" shall not apply to the
30	election of a person at a general election to fill an unexpired portion of a
31	term of office;
32	(25)(26) "Voting machine" means either:
33	(A) A direct recording electronic voting machine that:
34	(i) Records votes by means of a ballot display
35	provided with mechanical or electro-optical components that may be actuated
36	by the voter;

1	(ii) Processes the data by means of a computer
2	program;
3	(iii) Records voting data and ballot images in
4	internal and external memory components; and
5	(iv) Produces a tabulation of the voting data stored
6	in a removable memory component and in a printed copy; or
7	(B) An electronic device for marking a paper ballot to be
8	electronically scanned;
9	(26)(27) "Voter-verified paper audit trail" means a
10	contemporaneous paper record of a ballot printed for the voter to confirm his
11	or her votes before the voter casts his or her ballot that:
12	(A) Allows the voter to verify the voter-verified paper
13	audit trail before the casting of the voter's ballot;
14	(B) Is not retained by the voter;
15	(C) Does not contain individual voter information;
16	(D) Is produced on paper that is sturdy, clean, and
17	resistant to degradation; and
18	(E) Is readable in a manner that makes the voter's ballot
19	choices obvious to the voter without the use of computer or electronic code;
20	and
21	(27)(28) "Voting system" means:
22	(A) The total combination of mechanical,
23	electromechanical, or electronic equipment, including the software, firmware,
24	and documentation required to program, control, and support the equipment
25	that is used:
26	(i) To define ballots;
27	(ii) To cast and count votes;
28	(iii) To report or display election results; and
29	(iv) To maintain and produce any audit trail
30	information; and
31	(B) The practices and documentation used to:
32	(i) Identify system components and versions of
33	components;
34	(ii) Test the system during its development and
35	maintenance;
36	(iii) Maintain records of system errors and defects;

1 (iv) Determine specific system changes to be made to 2 a system after the initial qualification of the system; and 3 (v) Make available any materials to the voter, 4 including, but not limited to, notices, instructions, forms, or paper 5 ballots. 6 7 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 7-5-201 is amended to read as follows: 8 7-5-201. Voter qualification. 9 (a) To be qualified to vote, a person shall have registered at least 10 thirty (30) calendar days immediately prior to the election and in the manner 11 set forth by Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 51. The person shall be 12 eligible to vote only in the county in which he resides on the date thirtyone (31) calendar days prior to the election, unless specifically exempted 13 14 under § 7-5-406. 15 "Voting residence" shall be a voter's domicile and shall be 16 governed by the following provisions: 17 (1) The domicile of a person is that place in which his 18 habitation is fixed and to which, whenever he is absent, he has the intention 19 to return; 20 (2) A change of domicile is made only by the act of abandonment, 21 joined with the intent to remain in another place. A person can have only one 22 (1) domicile at any given time; 23 (3) A person does not lose his domicile if he temporarily leaves 24 his home and goes to another country, state, or place in this state with the 25 intent of returning; 26 (4) The place where a person's family resides is presumed to be 27 his place of domicile, but a person may acquire a separate residence if he 28 takes another abode with the intention of remaining there; 29 (5) A married person may be considered to have a domicile 30 separate from that of his spouse for the purposes of voting or holding office. For those purposes, domicile is determined as if the person were 31 32 single; and 33 (6) Persons who are temporarily living in a particular place 34 because of a temporary work-related assignment or duty post or as a result of

personnel, students, or office holders shall be deemed residents of that

their performing duties in connection with their status as military

35 36 place where they established their home prior to beginning such assignments or duties.

- 3 (c) No person may be qualified to vote in more than one (1) precinct 4 of any county at any one (1) time.
- 5 (d)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (d)(2) and subsection (e) of 6 this section, any person desiring to vote in this state shall:
- 7 (A) Present proof of identity to the election official 8 when appearing to vote in person either early or at the polls on election
- 9 day; or
- 10 (B) When voting by mail, submit with the ballot a copy of
- 11 a current and valid photo identification or a copy of a current utility bill,
- 12 bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that
- 13 shows the name and address of the voter.
- 14 (2)(A) A person who is a resident of a licensed nursing home,
- 15 <u>licensed residential care facility, licensed assisted-living facility, or any</u>
- 16 <u>licensed facility that provides long-term medical or personal care is not</u>
- 17 required to provide proof of identity before voting.
- 18 (B) A person not required to provide proof of identity
- 19 under subdivision (d)(2)(A) of this section shall provide documentation from
- 20 the administrator of the facility attesting that the person is a resident of
- 21 the facility.
- 22 (d)(e)(1) Any In addition to the proof of identity required by
- 23 <u>subsection (d)(1) of this section, any</u> person registering to vote by mail and
- 24 who has not previously voted in a federal election in this state shall:
- 25 (A) Present to the election official a current and valid
- 26 photo identification or copy of a current utility bill, bank statement,
- 27 government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the name
- 28 and address of the voter when appearing to vote in person either early or at
- 29 the polls on election day; or
- 30 (B) When voting by mail, submit with the ballot a copy of
- 31 a current and valid photo identification or a copy of a current utility bill,
- 32 bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that
- 33 shows the name and address of the voter.
- 34 (2) The provision of subdivision (d)(e)(1) of this section does
- 35 not include:
- 36 (A) Persons whose applications are transmitted by state or

1	federal voter registration agencies;
2	(B) Persons who are covered by the Uniformed and Overseas
3	Citizens Absentee Voting Act;
4	(C) Persons covered by the Voting Accessibility for the
5	Elderly and Handicapped Act;
6	(D) Persons who are entitled to vote otherwise than in
7	person under any other federal law;
8	(E) Persons who register to vote by mail and submit as
9	part of the registration any of the identification documents listed in
10	subdivision (d)(1) of this section; or
11	(F) Persons who register to vote by mail and submit with
12	the registration either a driver's license number or at least the last four
13	(4) digits of the individual's social security number and with respect to
14	whom a state or local election official matches the license number or social
15	security number with an existing state identification record bearing the same
16	number, name, and date of birth as provided in the registration.
17	(e)(f) Any person who receives an absentee ballot according to the
18	precinct voter registration list but who elects to vote by early voting or to
19	vote at his or her polling site on election day shall be permitted to cast a
20	provisional ballot.
21	
22	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 7-5-305(a)(8), concerning requests for
23	identification when voting, is amended to read as follows:
24	(8)(A)(i) Request Except as provided in subdivision
25	(a)(8)(A)(ii) and $(a)(8)(B)(ii)$ of this section, request the voter for
26	purposes of identification to provide a current and valid photo
27	identification or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement,
28	government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the name
29	and address of the voter proof of identity.
30	(ii)(a) A person who is a resident of a licensed
31	nursing home, licensed residential care facility, licensed assisted-living
32	facility, or any licensed facility that provides long-term medical or
33	personal care is not required to provide proof of identity before voting.
34	(b) A person not required to provide proof of
35	identity under subdivision (a)(8)(A)(ii)(a) of this section shall provide
36	documentation from the administrator of the facility attesting that the

1	person is a resident of the facility.
2	(B)(i) If a voter is unable to provide this identification
3	proof of identity, the election official shall:
4	(a) indicate Indicate on the precinct voter
5	registration list that the voter did not provide identification proof of
6	identity; and
7	(b) Permit the voter to cast a provisional
8	ballot.
9	(ii) A first-time voter who registers by mail
10	without providing identification when registering and desires to vote in
11	person but who does not meet the identification requirements of subdivision
12	(a)(8)(A) of this section § 7-5-201(e) may cast a provisional ballot.
13	(iii) Following each election, the county board of
14	election commissioners may review the precinct voter registration lists and
15	may provide the information of the voters not providing identification at the
16	polls to the prosecuting attorney.
17	(iv) The prosecuting attorney may investigate
18	possible voter fraud;
19	
20	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code Title 7, Chapter 5, Subchapter 3 is amended
21	to add a new section to read as follows:
22	7-5-321. Procedure when voter fails to provide proof of identity.
23	(a) If the voter is listed on the precinct voter registration list but
24	fails to provide proof of identity, the election official shall:
25	(1) Indicate on the precinct voter registration list that the
26	voter did not provide proof of identity; and
27	(2) Permit the voter to cast a provisional ballot.
28	(b)(1) A person who is a resident of a licensed nursing home, licensed
29	residential care facility, licensed assisted-living facility, or any licensed
30	facility that provides long-term medical or personal care is not required to
31	provide proof of identity before voting.
32	(2) A person not required to provide proof of identity under
33	subdivision (b)(1) of this section shall provide documentation from the
34	administrator of the facility attesting that the person is a resident of the
35	facility.
36	(c) A provisional ballot cast by a voter who did not provide proof of

1	identity shall be counted only if:
2	(1) The voter returns to the county board of election
3	commissioners by 12:00 p.m. on the Monday following the election and:
4	(A) Provides proof of identity; or
5	(B) Executes an affidavit stating that the voter cannot
6	provide proof of identity because the voter:
7	(i) Is indigent; or
8	(ii) Has a religious objection to being
9	photographed; and
10	(2) The voter has not been challenged or required to vote a
11	provisional ballot for any other reason.
12	
13	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 7-5-418 is amended to read as follows:
14	7-5-418. Early voting.
15	(a)(1)(A) Except as provided in subdivision (a)(1)(B) of this section,
16	early voting shall be available to any qualified elector who applies to the
17	county clerk's designated early voting location, beginning fifteen (15) days
18	before a preferential primary or general election between the hours of 8:00
19	a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.
20	Saturday and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the Monday before the election.
21	(B) Early voting shall not be available on state holidays.
22	(2) However, on all other elections, including, but not limited
23	to, general primary and general runoff elections, early voting shall be
24	available to any qualified elector who applies to the county clerk during
25	regular office hours, beginning fifteen (15) days before an election and
26	ending on the day before the election day at the time the county clerk's
27	office regularly closes.
28	(b)(1)(A) The county board of election commissioners may decide to
29	hold early voting at additional polling sites outside the offices of the
30	county clerk and to include the additional voting locations for a maximum of
31	fifteen (15) days on any of the days and times provided for in subsection (a)
32	of this section, if it so chooses.
33	(B) The county board shall determine by unanimous vote the
34	location of additional polling sites for early voting.
35	(C) The county clerk shall publish the location of
36	additional early voting polling sites in a newspaper of general circulation

- 1 at least five (5) days before early voting begins.
- 2 (2) The county board shall select the number of election
- 3 officials necessary to adequately staff the additional early voting polling
- 4 site or sites as in any other election.
- 5 (3)(A) The county board shall notify the county clerk of its
- 6 decision to hold early voting at additional polling sites outside the office
- 7 of the county clerk within ten (10) days of the decision.
- 8 (B)(i) If the county board decides to hold early voting at
- 9 additional polling sites outside the office of the county clerk, the county
- 10 clerk may choose not to hold early voting within the office of the county
- 11 clerk. The county clerk shall notify the county board within ten (10) days of
- 12 the receipt of notice from the county board regarding early voting at
- 13 additional polling sites.
- 14 (ii) If the county clerk decides not to hold early
- 15 voting within the office of the county clerk as provided in subdivision
- 16 (b)(3)(B)(i) of this section, early voting shall be held at one (1) or more
- 17 conveniently located polling sites on the days and times provided in
- 18 subsection (a) of this section.
- 19 (4) The early voting election official shall record the date on
- 20 all pages of the early voting roster or early voting request form and keep a
- 21 daily record of the number of early ballots cast.
- 22 (5) The county clerk shall publish the additional hours for
- 23 early voting with the location of additional early voting polling sites in a
- 24 newspaper of general circulation at least five (5) days before early voting
- 25 begins.
- 26 (6) All voted ballots and unvoted ballots and all related
- 27 election materials at each additional early voting polling site shall be
- 28 stored in a secure location in the county courthouse or in a secure location
- 29 as determined by the county board of election commissioners immediately after
- 30 the close of the additional polling sites each day that early voting is
- 31 conducted there.
- 32 (c) Before a person is permitted to cast an early vote, the county
- 33 clerk or election official shall:
- 34 (1) Request the voter to identify himself by stating his name,
- 35 date of birth, and address in order to verify his registration;
- 36 (2) Request the voter to present proof of identity to the county

- clerk or election official;
- 2  $\frac{(2)(3)}{(3)}$  If the voter's name or address is not the same as that in
- 3 the county voter registration record files, request the voter to complete an
- 4 updated voter registration application form;
- 5 (3)(4) Request the voter to sign an early voting roster or early
- 6 voting request form which identifies his name, address, date of birth, and
- 7 the date on the roster or form; and
- 8 (4)(5) Enter the voter's precinct number on the early voting
- 9 roster or early voting request form.
- 10 (d)(1) If the voter is not listed in the county voter registration
- 11 record files and the county clerk is unable to verify the voter's
- 12 registration and if the voter contends that he or she is eligible to vote,
- 13 then the voter may vote a provisional ballot which shall be counted only upon
- 14 verification of the voter's registration status.
- 15 (2)(A) If the voter fails to provide proof of identity, the
- 16 election official shall follow the procedure stated in Arkansas Code § 7-5-
- 17 <u>321.</u>
- 18 (B)(i) A person who is a resident of a licensed nursing
- 19 home, licensed residential care facility, licensed assisted-living facility,
- 20 or any licensed facility that provides long-term medical or personal care is
- 21 not required to provide proof of identity before voting.
- 22 (B)(ii) A person not required to provide proof of
- 23 identity under subdivision (d)(2)(B) of this section shall provide
- 24 documentation from the administrator of the facility attesting that the
- 25 person is a resident of the facility.
- 26 (e) The county clerk or county board shall furnish voting locations
- 27 that adequately allow the early voter to personally and secretly execute his
- 28 or her ballot.
- 29 (f) Upon casting his or her ballot, the voter shall then deposit the
- 30 ballot in the appropriate box in the same manner as for votes cast on the day
- 31 of the election.
- 32 (g) Early votes shall be counted at the same time as absentee ballots.
- 33 (h) Except as provided in this section, early voting shall be
- 34 conducted in the same manner as voting on election day. Conduct that is
- 35 prohibited or restricted on election day shall be subject to the same
- 36 prohibitions and restrictions on the days on which early voting is conducted.

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
