## Subtitle

13 AN ACT TO EXEMPT COUNTY INSPECTORS AND  
14 CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS FROM LAW  
15 ENFORCEMENT TRAINING REQUIREMENTS.  
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19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 12-9-108 is amended to read as follows:

22 12-9-108. Failure to meet qualifications – Effect – Exemptions.

23 (a) Actions taken by law enforcement officers who do not meet all of  
24 the standards and qualifications set forth in this subchapter or made by the  
25 Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training shall not be  
26 held invalid merely because of the failure to meet the standards and  
27 qualifications.

28 (b)(1) Nothing in this subchapter or any requirements made by the  
29 commission shall prevent any action by a private citizen that is now  
30 authorized by law.

31 (2) No provision of this subchapter shall affect the deputizing  
32 of a private citizen by a law enforcement officer in a time of a disaster or  
33 emergency.

34 (3) Nothing in this subchapter or any other law shall prohibit  
35 inspectors and code enforcement officers of cities ~~and~~, towns, or counties  
36 from issuing citations for the violation of municipal or county codes,



1 ordinances, or regulations that they are charged by their city ~~or~~, town, or  
2 county with the duty of enforcing.

3 (4)(A) Cities of the first class, cities of the second class,  
4 and incorporated towns are authorized to employ persons or to contract with  
5 private or public corporations, associations, or other entities, whether  
6 charitable, nonprofit, or for profit, that employ persons who do not meet  
7 certification requirements prescribed by the commission to enforce and  
8 execute any or all provisions of a municipal parking enforcement ordinance,  
9 including, but not limited to, the issuance of citations, the collection of  
10 fines, and any other parking enforcement process or procedure as may be  
11 established by ordinance of the municipality.

12 (B) Persons employed under this subdivision (b)(4) shall  
13 not carry firearms nor take any other official law enforcing action except  
14 that enumerated in subdivision (b)(4)(A) of this section.

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
