# A Bill

SENATE BILL 1001

## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A RACIAL PROFILING HOTLINE;  
10 TO ESTABLISH CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS OF THE ATTORNEY  
11 GENERAL IN REPORTING RACIAL PROFILING; AND FOR  
12 OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

15 TO ESTABLISH A RACIAL PROFILING HOTLINE  
16 AND TO ESTABLISH CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS OF  
17 THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IN REPORTING RACIAL  
18 PROFILING.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 12, Subchapter 12 is amended to add a  
24 new section to read as follows:

25 12-12-1405. Racial profiling hotline.

26 (a)(1) The Attorney General shall establish and publish procedures to  
27 receive complaints concerning racial profiling.

28 (2) The procedures shall include the operation of a toll-free  
29 hotline and may include procedures to receive written complaints through the  
30 mail, email, or facsimile.

31 (b) The Attorney General shall maintain statewide statistics on  
32 complaints received concerning racial profiling.

33 (c) The Attorney General annually shall report statewide statistics on  
34 complaints concerning racial profiling received under this section during a  
35 year no later than October 1 of the next year to the Legislative Council and  
36 the Task Force on Racial Profiling.



1           (d) If the Attorney General suspects that a violation of law has  
2 occurred, the Attorney General shall refer the matter to the appropriate  
3 prosecuting attorney or other appropriate legal authority.

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
