10 AN ACT TO CREATE THE LEGISLATIVE TASK FORCE ON
11 AUTISM; TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ITS
12 MEMBERS; TO DESCRIBE ITS MISSION AND
13 RESPONSIBILITIES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Subtitle

15 AN ACT TO CREATE THE LEGISLATIVE TASK
16 FORCE ON AUTISM.
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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22 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 10, Chapter 3 is amended to add an
23 additional subchapter to read as follows:

24 10-3-2501. Title.

25 This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Arkansas
26 Legislative Task Force on Autism Act".
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28 10-3-2502. Arkansas Legislative Task Force on Autism – Creation.

29 (a) The Arkansas Legislative Task Force on Autism is created.

30 (b) The task force shall consist of the following members:

31 (1) One (1) member of the House of Representatives appointed by
32 the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

33 (2) One (1) member of the Senate appointed by the President Pro
34 Tempore of the Senate;

35 (3) One (1) member who is an employee of the Division of Medical
36 Services of the Department of Health and Human Services appointed by the



1 Director of the Department of Health and Human Services;

2 (4) One (1) member who is a Board Certified Behavior Analyst
3 appointed by the Arkansas Psychology Board;

4 (5) One (1) member to represent Easter Seals appointed by Easter
5 Seals Arkansas;

6 (6) The Director of the Division of Developmental Disabilities
7 Services of the Department of Health and Human Services;

8 (7) The Behavior Intervention Coordinator of the Department of
9 Education;

10 (8) One (1) member to represent Arkansas Blue Cross and Blue
11 Shield;

12 (9) One (1) member who is a pediatric physician who regularly
13 works with autistic patients appointed by the Dennis Developmental Center of
14 the Department of Pediatrics of the University of Arkansas for Medical
15 Sciences;

16 (10) One (1) member who is a clinical geneticist appointed by
17 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences;

18 (11) One (1) member to represent Partners for Inclusive
19 Communities of the University Centers of Excellence in Developmental
20 Disabilities Education, Research, and Service of the University of Arkansas
21 for Medical Sciences;

22 (12) The Behavior Intervention Services Coordinator for the
23 Department of Education;

24 (13) The Associate Director of Special Education of the
25 Department of Education;

26 (14) One(1) public school Special Education Supervisor appointed
27 by the Arkansas Association of Special Education Administrators;

28 (15) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Children's
29 Hospital Research Institute appointed by Arkansas Children's Hospital;

30 (16) Four (4) members who are parents or guardians of children
31 with autism appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and

32 (17) Four (4) members who are parents or guardians of children
33 with autism appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

34 (c)(1) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall call the
35 first of the task force meeting within thirty (30) days of the effective date
36 of this subchapter.

1 (2) At the first meeting, the members of the task force shall
2 elect from the membership a chair and other officers as needed for the
3 transaction of its business.

4 (3)(A) The task force shall conduct its meetings in Pulaski
5 County at the State Capitol.

6 (B) Meetings shall be held at least one (1) time every
7 three (3) months but may occur more often at the call of the chair.

8 (d)(1) If a vacancy occurs among the legislative members of the task
9 force, the vacancy shall be filled by the same process as the original
10 appointment.

11 (2) If a vacancy occurs among the nonlegislative members of the
12 task force, the vacancy shall be filled by vote of the task force.

13 (e) The task force shall establish rules and procedures for conducting
14 its business.

15 (f) A majority of the members of the task force shall constitute a
16 quorum for transacting any business of the task force.

17 (g) The Bureau of Legislative Research shall provide staff for the
18 task force.

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20 10-3-2503. Arkansas Legislative Task Force on Autism – Duties.

21 (a) The Arkansas Legislative Task Force on Autism shall:

22 (1) Examine how the State of Arkansas responds to autism and
23 autism spectrum disorders;

24 (2) Determine the best practices to treat autism and autism
25 spectrum disorders;

26 (3) Recommend more efficient methods for treating autism and
27 autism spectrum disorders;

28 (4) Recommend how to obtain more federal funds for treating
29 autism and autism spectrum disorders and provide special education to
30 children with autism and autism spectrum disorders; and

31 (5) Recommend to the General Assembly specific changes to the
32 law that will improve treatment of autism and autism spectrum disorders and
33 improve the provision of special education to children with autism and autism
34 spectrum disorders.

35 (b) On or before August 31 of each year, the task force shall provide
36 the General Assembly with a written explanation of the recommended

1 legislative changes.
