9 AN ACT TO AMEND JULI'S LAW; TO REQUIRE THAT A DNA
10 SAMPLE BE TAKEN FROM A PERSON ARRESTED FOR RAPE; TO
11 DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

15 AN ACT TO AMEND JULI'S LAW; TO REQUIRE
16 THAT A DNA SAMPLE BE TAKEN FROM A PERSON
17 ARRESTED FOR RAPE AND TO DECLARE AN
18 EMERGENCY.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
22

23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 12-12-1006(a)(2), concerning DNA sample
24 collection under Juli's Law, is amended to read as follows:

25 (2) In addition to the requirements of subdivision (a)(1) of
26 this section, a law enforcement official at the receiving criminal detention
27 facility shall take~~r~~, or cause to be taken~~r~~, a DNA sample of a person arrested
28 for~~r~~

29 (A) Capital murder, § 5-10-101;

30 (B) Murder in the first degree, § 5-10-102;

31 (C) Kidnapping, § 5-11-102;

32 (D) Rape, § 5-14-103;

33 ~~(D)~~(E) Sexual assault in the first degree, § 5-14-124; or

34 ~~(E)~~(F) Sexual assault in the second degree, § 5-14-125.

36 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the



1 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Juli's law is intended to
2 protect Arkansans from heinous crimes; that rape is a heinous crime that can
3 occur at any time; that the protections under Juli's Law will be enhanced by
4 the addition of rape as a reportable crime; and because no time should be
5 lost in providing this protection to the people of Arkansas. Therefore, an
6 emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for
7 the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become
8 effective on:

9 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

10 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
11 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
12 bill; or

13 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
14 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
