For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO EXEMPT ORGANIZED CAMPS AND RELIGIOUS AND
10 NONPROFIT EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCE CENTERS FROM THE
11 DEFINITION OF EMPLOYEE UNDER THE MINIMUM WAGE LAW; TO
12 DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

15 TO EXEMPT ORGANIZED CAMPS AND RELIGIOUS
16 AND NONPROFIT EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCE
17 CENTERS FROM THE DEFINITION OF EMPLOYEE
18 UNDER THE MINIMUM WAGE LAW; AND TO
19 DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
24

25 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 11-4-203(3), concerning exemptions for the
26 definition of employee under the minimum wage law, is amended to add an
27 additional subdivision to read as follows:

28 (R)(i) An individual employed by an establishment that is
29 an organized camp or a religious or nonprofit educational conference center
30 if:

31 (a) The organized camp or a religious or non-
32 profit educational conference center does not operate for more than seven (7)
33 months in a calendar year; or

34 (b) During the preceding calendar year, the
35 average receipts of the organized camp or a religious or nonprofit
36 educational conference center for any six (6) months of the preceding



1 calendar year were not more than thirty-three and one-third percent (33 1/3%)
2 of the average receipts of the organized camp or a religious or nonprofit
3 educational conference center for the other six (6) months of the preceding
4 calendar year.

5 (ii) This subdivision (3)(R) is effective
6 retroactively as of January 1, 2006.

8 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
9 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that organized camps and religious
10 and nonprofit educational conference centers begin preparations for summer
11 camps and conferences several months before the summer season begins; that
12 organized camps and religious and nonprofit educational conference centers
13 need clarity about staff wages early in the season-preparation and planning
14 process; and that this act is immediately necessary because organized camps
15 and religious and nonprofit educational conference centers will be harmed if
16 they cannot immediately construct an accurate picture of the costs of
17 operating during the forthcoming summer season. Therefore, an emergency is
18 declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the
19 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
20 on:

21 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

22 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
23 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
24 bill; or

25 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
26 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
