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1	(5) One (1) member of the General Assembly from the Fourth

8	(8) One (1) representative from the Arkansas Education

12	(10) One (1) representative from the Arkansas School Boards
13	Association;
14	(11) One (1) representative from the Department of Education;
15	(12) One (1) representative from the Disability Rights
16	Association;
17	(13) One (1) representative from the Arkansas Association of
18	Special Education Administrators;
19	(14) One (1) representative from a charter school origination or
20	support group for charter schools;
21	(15) One (1) representative from an institution of higher
22	education who works in a teacher preparation program specializing in special
23	education;
24	(16) One (1) special education teacher appointed by the
25	Department of Education;
26	(17) Four (4) parents of special education students with one (1)
27	parent to be appointed by each legislative member of the task force; and
28	(18) Two (2) special education students with one (1) student to
29	be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and one (1) student
30	to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
31	(c)(l) The Governor or his or her designee shall call the first
32	meeting of the task force within sixty (60) days of the effective date of
33	this act and shall serve as the chair of the task force at the first meeting.
34	(2) At the first meeting of the task force, the members of the
35	task force shall elect from its membership a chair and other officers as
36	needed for the transaction of business.

1	(3)(A) The task force shall conduct its meetings at the State
2	Capitol or another site selected by the chair.
3	(B) Meetings of the task force shall be held at least one
4	(1) time every three (3) months but may occur more often at the call of the
5	chair.
6	(4) The task force shall establish rules and procedures for
7	conducting its business.
8	(5) If a vacancy occurs on the task force, the vacancy shall be
9	filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
10	(6)(A) Legislative members of the task force shall be paid per
11	diem and mileage as authorized by law for attendance at meetings of interim
12	committees of the General Assembly.
13	(B) Non-legislative members of the task force shall serve
14	without compensation but may receive reimbursement under § 25-16-902.
15	(7)(A) A majority of the members of the task force shall
16	constitute a quorum for transacting business of the task force.
17	(B) No action may be taken by the task force except by a
18	majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present.
19	(8) The task force may expend funds and resources in carrying
20	out its purpose and responsibilities that are appropriated or funded to the
21	commission by the General Assembly or a third party.
22	(9) The Bureau of Legislative Research shall provide staff for
23	the task force.
24	(d)(1) The task force shall study and research ways to improve special
25	education and how special education can positively impact student education
26	and achievement outcomes.
27	(2) In executing the duties and responsibilities of the task
28	force, the task force shall:
29	(A) Review the current practice for identifying students
30	for special education services and programs in public schools in Arkansas and
31	other states;
32	(B) Compare outcomes of students participating in special
33	education services in programs in Arkansas with those in other states;
34	(C) Review the requirements for teacher preparation and
35	licensure of special education teachers in Arkansas and other states;
36	(D) Review the requirements for professional development

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T	related to special education, including anticipated changes to professional
2	development in Arkansas and other states;
3	(E) Review support staff and staffing ratios for special
4	education services and programs, including nurses, teacher aides, and
5	personal student aids;
6	(F) Review discipline practices for students in special
7	education programs in Arkansas and other states;
8	(G) Review Response to Intervention (RTI) practices in
9	Arkansas, including identifying RTI programs in public schools that are
10	successful and can be identified as best practices;
11	(H) Review the current practice for screening students for
12	learning disabilities and the services provided for students with learning
13	disabilities;
14	(I) Review the availability of support services for
15	special education programs, students, and families, including without
16	limitation behavioral health services and social services with an effort made
17	to identify best practices;
18	(J) Review the practices of school districts regarding
19	self-contained classrooms, inclusion programs, and resource rooms, including
20	model policies and programs in Arkansas and other states;
21	(K) Review the use of outside services and organizations
22	by school districts that provide the best level or support for students
23	receiving special education services or participating in special education
24	programs;
25	(L) Review the facilities, equipment, and materials
26	available in school districts for special education services and programs;
27	(M) Compare the amount of academic instruction with the
28	training time for independent function and career development;
29	(N) Review special education services and programs
30	currently in Arkansas public charter schools and public charter schools
31	outside of Arkansas;
32	(0) Identify exemplary school district special education
33	programs in Arkansas and other states; and
34	(P) Review the research and findings of national
35	organizations that support students receiving special education services or
36	students participating in special education programs.

1	(3) For each item under subdivision (d)(2) of this section, the		
2	task force shall consider the separate strengths and challenges for children		
3	who:		
4	(A) Are developmentally delayed;		
5	(B) Have severe behavioral challenges; or		
6	(C) Have severe physical disabilities.		
7	(4)(A) The task force also shall review the financial support		
8	provided for special education services and programs, including whether or		
9	not the financial support provided is adequate to meet the needs of the		
10	students in special education programs or receiving special education		
11	services.		
12	(B) The review under subdivision (d)(4)(A) shall include a		
13	review of the financial practices of school districts in Arkansas for the		
14	support of special education services and programs.		
15	(e)(1) On or before February 1, 2016, the task force shall file with		
16	the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro		
17	Tempore of the Senate, and the chairs of the House and Senate Committees on		
18	Education a written, preliminary report of the task force's activities,		
19	findings, and recommendations.		
20	(2)(A) On or before September 1, 2016, the task force shall file		
21	with the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President		
22	Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the chairs of the House Committee on Education		
23	and Senate Committee on Education a written, final report of the task force's		
24	activities, findings, and recommendations.		
25	(B) The task force may file an updated final report on or		
26	before July 1, 2017.		
27	(f) The task force expires on July 1, 2017.
