31	tribunals, applied by that jurisdiction's courts, administrative bodies, or
32	other formal or informal tribunals.
33	(B) "Foreign law, legal code, or system" does not mean any
34	laws of the Native American tribes in this state; and
35	(3) "Religious organization" means a church, seminary,
36	synagogue, temple, mosque, religious order, religious corporation,
