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25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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27	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-17-402(b)-(d), concerning teacher	
28	licensure, is amended to read as follows:	
29	(b)(1) The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules and	
30	regulations for the issuance, licensure, relicensure, and continuance of	
31	licensure of teachers in the public schools of this state.	
32	(2)(A) In addition to other requirements, any:	
33	(i) A person applying for initial licensure as a	
34	secondary level teacher or <u>as an</u> administrator in the public schools or a	
35	licensed <u>secondary level</u> teacher, a <u>licensed elementary general education</u>	
36	teacher, or an administrator applying for a license in an additional area	

1 shall take and complete a test recognized by the National Council for 2 Accreditation of Teacher Education and approved by the State Board of 3 Education and submit the scores to the Department of Education-; and 4 (ii)(a) A person applying for initial licensure as 5 an elementary level general education teacher or an elementary level special 6 education teacher shall take and complete the Foundations of Reading Test and 7 the General Curriculum Test of the Massachusetts Tests for Educator 8 Licensure, including the mathematics subtest, and submit the scores to the 9 department. 10 (b) The State Board of Education shall not 11 require additional testing for a person applying for initial licensure as an 12 elementary level general education teacher or an elementary level special 13 education teacher other than what is required under subdivision 14 (b)(2)(A)(ii)(a) of this section. 15 (B)(i) No An applicant for initial licensure or licensure 16 in an additional area shall not receive a license after July 1, 2007, unless 17 the applicant scores at or above the minimum level set by the State Board of 18 Education that is consistent with the recommendations of the Professional 19 Licensure Standards Board. 20 (ii) For tests administered under subdivision (b)(2)(A)(ii) of this section, the cut scores shall be set by the State Board 21 22 of Education, with strong consideration given to the cut scores used in 23 Massachusetts. 24 (C) All colleges and universities in this state shall 25 report the results of the examinations to the department upon request. 26 (c) The State Board of Education shall not delegate to any a college 27 or university any of the State Board of Education's powers or duties 28 pertaining to the issuance, licensure, relicensure, and continuance of 29 licensure of teachers in public schools in this state. 30 (d) The State Board of Education shall waive the examination 31 requirements under subsection (b) of this section for an individual applying 32 for a first-time Arkansas license who has a valid out-of-state teaching

license and three (3) years' documented teaching experience as required by

1 6-17-403. Provisional licensure for teachers trained and licensed in 2 other states.

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- (a) The State Board of Education may issue a one-year nonrenewable provisional license to any teacher who seeks Arkansas licensure and is trained in and licensed by a state other than Arkansas <u>if the teacher has been in good standing during the most recent three</u> (3) years of teaching in another state.
- (b)(1) Any  $\underline{A}$  person who has not successfully completed the licensure examination designated by the state board tests required under  $\S-6-17-601$  et seq. 6-17-402 and who has not previously held an Arkansas license but meets degree, course work, and experience requirements for a standard license and who otherwise qualifies to teach in the public schools of this state may receive a one-year nonrenewable provisional license and be employed by any public school district in this state for a period not to exceed one (1) year.
- (2) A school district that hires a teacher who has not successfully completed the examination licensure tests required under § 6-17-402 shall not be penalized by the state board provided that if the length of employment of the teacher while nonlicensed does not exceed one (1) year.
- 19 (c) The state board shall issue a standard five-year teaching license 20 to an individual who furnishes <u>to</u> the Department of Education proof of the 21 following:
- 22 (1) A valid standard teaching license or its Arkansas equivalent 23 that:
- 24 (A) Was issued in another state; and
- 25 (B) Has been in good standing during the most recent <del>two</del> 26 <del>(2)</del> three (3) years of the applicant's teaching experience;
- 27 (2) Successful completion of the criminal records checks and 28 Child Maltreatment Central Registry check under § 6-17-410;
- 29 (3) Higher education transcripts evidencing the award of at 30 least a baccalaureate degree;
- 31 (4) Reports evidencing test scores required for licensing by the
  32 licensing state, unless the individual has three (3) years of documented
  33 teaching experience Successful completion of the licensure tests required
  34 under § 6-17-402;
- 35 (5) Completion of a program for:
- 36 (A) Teacher education at a regionally accredited

2	(B) Teacher education nationally accredited by an
3	accrediting organization recognized by the United States Department of
4	Education, the Council for Higher Education Accreditation, or the Council for

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10	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-17-409(e)(1) and (2), concerning
11	nontraditional teacher licensure, are amended to read as follows:
12	(e)(1) As used in this subsection, "accelerated teaching program"
13	means a program intended for college graduates that provides intensive
14	training and support for a period of two (2) or more years for teaching and
15	leading in schools.
16	(2) The state board shall issue a standard five-year teaching
17	license to an applicant if the applicant has:
18	(A) Either:
19	(i) Successfully completed an accelerated teaching
20	program, including:
21	(a) The Teach For America, Inc., program;
22	(b) The Arkansas Teacher Corps program offered
23	by the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville;
24	(c) The American Board for the Certification
25	of Teacher Excellence program; or
26	(d) Another accelerated teaching program
27	approved by the department; or
28	(ii) Been awarded a master's degree in teaching from
29	an accredited program at an institution of higher education; and
30	(B) Successfully completed the criminal records checks and
31	Child Maltreatment Central Registry check under § 6-17-410+; and
32	(C) Successfully completed the licensure tests required
33	under § 6-17-402.
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35	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-17-603(a), concerning the reporting and
36	confidentiality of test scores is amended to read as follows:

T	(a)(1) Scores from the tests required under <del>the provisions of</del> this
2	subchapter and § 6-17-402 shall not be disclosed but shall be retained by the
3	Department of Education as confidential records not subject to the Freedom of
4	Information Act of 1967, § 25-19-101 et seq., or any other act which that
5	would require the disclosure thereof.
6	(2) However, the department shall provide each licensee with
7	that person's test score and the grader's analysis of the writing portion of
8	the test.
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
