8 AN ACT REQUIRING THAT THE ARKANSAS COMMISSION ON LAW
9 ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS AND TRAINING CONDUCT A STUDY ON
10 THE FEASIBILITY OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT BEING ALLOWED TO
11 ESTABLISH ITS OWN LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY; AND FOR
12 OTHER PURPOSES.

15 REQUIRING THAT THE ARKANSAS COMMISSION ON
16 LAW ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS AND TRAINING
17 CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE FEASIBILITY OF A

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
24

25 SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY. Temporary legislation.

26 (a) The Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training
27 shall conduct a study on the feasibility of school districts being allowed to
28 establish their own law enforcement agencies.

29 (b) The study under this act shall address the following subjects, as
30 well as any ancillary topics that may arise during the course of the study:

31 (1) Potential positive and negative impacts;

32 (2) The legal and governmental mechanisms needed to establish a
33 school district-based law enforcement agency;

34 (3) Potential legal issues and intersection with the Department
35 of Education;

36 (4) An analysis of acts of school violence nationwide and the



1 effect having armed staff would have had on the outcome of those acts;

2 (5) A fiscal analysis of the potential costs;

3 (6) A study of the framework used in surrounding states such as
4 Oklahoma, Texas, and Mississippi;

5 (7) Potential liability issues;

6 (8) An analysis of the type of training that would be required;

7 and

8 (9) An analysis of contract options with other school districts
9 or law enforcement agencies to supply armed security.

10 (c) The study under this act shall be completed no later than July 1,
11 2020, and reported to the Chair of the House Committee on Judiciary and the
12 Chair of the Senate Committee on Judiciary.
