36 SECTION 70. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
2 INNOVATION AND PROJECT DEVELOPMENT FUND TRANSFERS. The Department of
3 Transformation & Shared Services - Division of Information Systems is a cost
4 recovery agency subject to the requirements of the United States Office of
5 Management and Budget Circular A-87 Cost Principles for State, Local and
6 Indian Tribal Government (A-87) and Cost Principles for Developing Cost
7 Allocation Plans and Indirect Cost Rates for Agreements with the Federal
8 Government Implementation Guide for the Office of Management and Budget
9 Circular A-87 (ASMBC-10). To comply with these federal rules, it is necessary
10 to establish an Innovation and Project Development appropriation and general
11 revenue fund account within the Department of Finance and Administration -
12 Disbursing Officer for the Department of Transformation & Shared Services -
13 Division of Information Systems. This fund shall be used for state enterprise
14 innovation projects that would enhance the technology operations of the State
15 that cannot be cost allocated to federal programs. The Department of
16 Transformation & Shared Services - Division of Information Systems will
17 maintain documentation for projects billed for these purposes. Fund transfers
18 may be made from the General Revenue Fund Account, upon the approval of the
19 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and prior review of the Arkansas
20 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, to reimburse the Department of
21 Transformation & Shared Services - Division of Information Systems for the
22 amounts billed.

28 FORCE 2000 DISTRIBUTION. After the amounts to be made available to the
29 various technical institutes or comprehensive lifelong learning centers have

31 205(d)(2)(B), such documents as may be necessary shall be processed so that
32 funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund to the
33 State Treasury fund or fund account from which the technical institute or
34 comprehensive lifelong learning center draws its general revenue support.
35 Such funds as may be transferred shall not exceed 6.309% of the total funds
36 available from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund during each fiscal year.

1 In the event that a technical college, community college or educational
2 institution which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund
3 as determined by law transfers from the Arkansas Technical College and
4 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies
5 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force
6 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational
7 institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of
8 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund.

9 The funds distributed under Arkansas Code § 26-51-205(d)(2)(C) in excess
10 of those amounts collected and distributed prior to June 30, 2014 shall be
11 deposited into the Skills Development Fund to be used only for personal
12 services, grants, operation, support, and improvement of occupational,

28 appropriations provided for Personal Services Extra Help in the Miscellaneous

21 federal funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas Children's

31 Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016 for any state agency, pursuant to
32 Arkansas Code § 19-4-701 et seq., said agency shall request a transfer of
33 appropriation from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, stating clearly the
34 amount required. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State said
35 appropriations shall be established upon the books of the Department of
36 Finance and Administration in compliance with the applicable classifications

1 of appropriations as enumerated in Arkansas Code §§ 19-4-521 through 19-4-
2 527.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~

6 SECTION 76. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

8 TRANSFER AUTHORITY. From time to time, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State

28 SECTION 78. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
30 PROCEDURES - VARIOUS TEMPORARY APPROPRIATION FOR STATE AGENCIES AND
31 INSTITUTIONS. (i) In the event that sufficient appropriation is not provided
32 by the General Assembly for any state agency or institution, an agency or
33 institution may request a transfer of appropriation, as provided in the
34 Various Temporary Appropriation for State Agencies and Institutions
35 Appropriation Section of this Act, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
36 State, stating clearly the amount requested, purpose and any additional

1 information requested by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.

2 (ii) After reviewing a request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may
3 deny, modify or approve the agencies or institutions request based on the
4 estimated amount of appropriation needed and currently available, purpose,
5 estimated funding available and preferred spending priority. Upon approval
6 or modification of a request by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and
7 after meeting the requirements of subsection (iii) herein, the Department of
8 Finance and Administration shall establish the transfer of appropriation on
9 the books of the Department of Finance and Administration and the State
10 Auditor, in compliance with the applicable classifications of appropriations
11 as enumerated in Arkansas Code 19-4-521 through 19-4-525.

12 (iii) Any request approved as authorized in subsection (ii) herein,
13 including requests that establish a new commitment item or new appropriation
14 shall require prior approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or if
15 meeting in Regular or Fiscal Session the Joint Budget Committee.

16 (iv) Any appropriation approved as authorized in this Section shall not be
17 carried forward to the next fiscal year and shall be identified as a change
18 level increase by the state agency or institution, if requested.

19 (v) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation for a state agency or
20 institution each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly.
21 This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the
22 appropriation act(s) for a state agency or institution. Further, the General
23 Assembly has determined that a state agency or institution may operate more
24 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the state agency or
25 institution authorizing broad powers under this section. Therefore, it is
26 both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight
27 by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
28 Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the
29 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this
30 section. If the requirement or approval by the Legislative Council or Joint
31 Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent
32 jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

36 SECTION 79. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds

4 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
6 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
7 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
8 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

9
10 SECTION 80. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
11 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
12 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
13 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
14 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
15 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
16 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
17 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

18
19 SECTION 81. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
20 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
21 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
22 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2021 is essential to the operation of
23 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided; with the
24 exception that Sections 37 and 39 in this Act shall be in full force and
25 effect from and after the date of its passage and approval, and that in the
26 event of an extension of the Legislative Session, the delay in the effective
27 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2021, with the exception that Sections 37 and
28 39 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of
29 its passage and approval, could work irreparable harm upon the proper
30 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore,
31 an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
32 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in
33 full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021; with the exception that
34 Sections 37 and 39 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from and
35 after the date of its passage and approval.
