No expenditure from the Environmental Settlement 22 Trust Fund for information technology needs may be made without prior 23 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, after seeking review of 24 the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. Further, 25 utilization of this appropriation for information technology needs of the 26 Arkansas Department Division of Environmental Quality must also be approved 27 by the Executive Chief Information Officer after the project is evaluated on 28 the methodology recommended by the Chief Information Officer and the CIO 29 Council, including an analysis of the return on investment and linkage to the 30 Department's Division's business objectives. Any approved projects and 31 expenditures for information technology from the Environmental Settlement 32 Trust Fund shall be reported annually to the Joint Committee on Advanced 33 Communications and Information Technology. 34 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2020 35 2021 through June 30, <del>2021</del> 2022.

1 SECTION 45. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND TRANSFER PROVISION. For the purposes of the fund transfers provided for in the 21 preceding Fund Transfer Provision special language section, the amounts 22 transferred shall not be considered as part of any statutory limitation on 23 the use of funds for administration of programs of the Department Division. 24 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2020 25 2021 through June 30, <del>2021</del> 2022. 26 27 SECTION 47. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LANDFILL 28 POST-CLOSURE CLEAN UP RESTRICTIONS. Any expenditures in excess of \$50,000 29 30 \$2,000,000 per site from the Landfill Post-Closure Trust Fund, as 31 appropriated in the Contractual Services line item of the Landfill Post-32 Closure Program appropriation section, for corrective action to remedy 33 environmental impacts of closed disposal sites previously operated as a 34 landfill pursuant to state law, will be prioritized and authorized shall be 35 subject to review and approval by the Arkansas Pollution Control and Ecology 36 Commission after addressing corrective actions needed to address

- 1 environmental impacts from permitted landfills closed properly. Expenditures
- 2 exceeding \$2,000,000 per fiscal year must be approved by the Arkansas
- 3 Pollution Control and Ecology Commission.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2020

- 7 SECTION 48. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

- 9 HAZARDOUS SITE CLEAN UP RESTRICTIONS. Expenditures from the Division of

- (d) Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of appropriation and general revenue funding for a cabinet-level department each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by delineating the maximums in the appropriation act or acts and establishing authorized positions and the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization Law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the cabinet-level departments created under Acts 2019, No. 910, may operate more efficiently if some flexibility is provided as authorized under this section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee, as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.
- (e) The provisions of this section shall be in effect from the date of passage through June 30,  $\frac{2021}{2022}$ .

SECTION 52. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 53. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive

10	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in

14	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
15	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
