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34	SECTION 2. DO	NOT CODIFY. Legislative findings.
35	(a) The Gener	al Assembly finds that throughout the Arkansas Code there
36	are a number of stat	utes already in place that protect our most vulnerable

1 and disparate populations. 2 (b) Some particular examples are as follows: 3 (1) Section 5-38-301 criminalizes, among other things, arson of 4 dedicated church property used as a place of worship; 5 (2) Section 5-71-207 criminalizes disorderly conduct including 6 purposely causing public inconvenience, annoyance, or alarm or recklessly 7 creating a risk of public inconvenience, annoyance, or alarm, if the person 8 in a public place mars, defiles, desecrates, or otherwise damages a 9 "religious symbol that is an object of respect by the public or a substantial 10 segment of the public"; 11 (3) Section 5-71-215 criminalizes, among other things, damages 12 to any place of worship; 13 (4) Section 6-10-114 prohibits: 14 (A) Discrimination against a student for race, national 15 origin, or ethnic background by a school board member, administrator, or 16 school employee, and that person's license may be suspended; and 17 (B) Authorizing or participating in a discriminatory 18 activity, retaliation for reporting, or allowing students to participate in a 19 discriminatory activity; 20 (5) Section 6-18-514 prohibits bullying in a public school which includes bullying for "attributes", "including without limitation race, 21 22 color, religion, ancestry, national origin, socioeconomic status, academic 23 status, disability, gender, gender identity, physical appearance, health 24 condition, or sexual orientation"; 25 (6) Section 6-81-606 prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, or area of teacher education in 26 27 the Teacher Opportunity Program; (7) Section 16-123-106 under the Arkansas Civil Rights Act of 28 29 1993, § 16-123-101 et seq., concerns hate offenses and allows civil action for intimidation, harassment, personal violence, and vandalism to real or 30 personal property motivated by racial, religious, or ethnic animosity; 31 32 (8) Section 16-123-107 under the Arkansas Civil Rights Act of 1993, § 16-123-101 et seq., prohibits discrimination because of race, 33 34 religion, national origin, gender, or the presence of any sensory, mental, or

(9) The Arkansas Fair Housing Act, § 16-123-201 et seq.,

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physical disability;

1	prohibits misconduct in real estate transactions "on the basis of religion,
2	race, color, national origin, sex, disability, or familial status" and
3	authorizes a civil action for damages and attorney's fees;
4	(10) Section 16-123-310 prohibits discrimination in the sale or
5	rental of housing because of race, color, religion, sex, familial status, or
6	national origin;
7	(11) Section 16-123-348 prohibits willfully injuring,
8	intimidating, or interfering with, or attempting to injure, intimidate, or
9	interfere with, a person because of his or her race, color, religion, sex,
10	disability, familial status, or national origin regarding housing
11	transactions;
12	(12) Section 16-123-404 prohibits the government from
13	substantially burdening "a person's exercise of religion";
14	(13) Section 21-12-103 authorizes all state agencies to
15	terminate an employee for prohibited discrimination "based upon race, creed,
16	religion, national origin, age, sex, or gender";
17	(14) Section 23-66-206 prohibits unfair methods of competition
18	and unfair or deceptive acts or practices, including "refusing to insure or
19	$\underline{\text{continue to insure an individual or risks solely because of the individual's}}\\$
20	race, color, creed, national origin, citizenship, status as a victim of
21	domestic abuse, or sex"; and
22	(15) Section 23-114-404 prohibits denial of admission to a
23	raffle or a game of bingo because of race, color, creed, religion, national
24	origin, sex, or disability.
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26	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 5, Chapter 4, Subchapter 1, is amended
27	to add an additional section to read as follows:
28	5-4-110. Prevention of victim's constitutional rights — Findings
29	required.
30	(a) As used in this section:
31	(1) "Constitutional right" means:
32	(A) An enumerated right contained in the following
33	amendments to the United States Constitution:
34	(i) The First Amendment;
35	(ii) The Second Amendment;
36	(iii) The Thirteenth Amendment;

1	(iv) The Fifteenth Amendment;		
2	(v) The Nineteenth Amendment;		
3	(vi) The Twenty-Fourth Amendment; and		
4	(vii) The Twenty-Sixth Amendment; and		
5	(B) An enumerated right contained in the following		
6	provisions of the Arkansas Constitution:		
7	(i) Article 2, § 1;		
8	(ii) Article 2, § 3;		
9	(iii) Article 2, § 4;		
10	(iv) Article 2, § 5;		
11	(v) Article 2, § 6;		
12	(vi) Article 2, § 13;		
13	(vii) Article 2, § 21;		
14	(viii) Article 2, § 24;		
15	(ix) Article 2, § 26;		
16	(x) Amendment 34; and		
17	(xi) Amendment 51; and		
18	(2) "Felony involving violence" means the same as defined in §

20	(b) The state may allege in the information or indictment that a		
21	defendant committed a felony involving violence for the purpose of preventing		
22	a person from exercising his or her constitutional right.		
23	(c) If the state makes the allegation described under subsection (b)		
24	of this section, the finder of fact shall make a finding beyond a reasonable		
25	doubt whether the person committed the felony involving violence for the		
26	purpose of preventing a person from exercising his or her constitutional		
27	right.		
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29	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 5-4-401 is amended to read as follows:		
30	5-4-401. Sentence.		
31	(a) A Except for a defendant sentenced under subsection (c) of this		
32	section, a defendant convicted of a felony shall receive a determinate		
33	sentence according to the following limitations:		
34	(1) For a Class Y felony, the sentence shall be not less than		
35	ten (10) years and not more than forty (40) years, or life;		
36	(2) For a Class A felony, the sentence shall be not less than		

- 1 six (6) years nor more than thirty (30) years;
- 2 (3) For a Class B felony, the sentence shall be not less than
- 3 five (5) years nor more than twenty (20) years;
- 4 (4) For a Class C felony, the sentence shall be not less than
- 5 three (3) years nor more than ten (10) years;
- 6 (5) For a Class D felony, the sentence shall not exceed six (6)
- 7 years; and
- 8 (6) For an unclassified felony, the sentence shall be in
- 9 accordance with a limitation of the statute defining the felony.
- 10 (b) A defendant convicted of a misdemeanor may be sentenced according
- 11 to the following limitations:
- 12 (1) For a Class A misdemeanor, the sentence shall not exceed one
- 13 (1) year;
- 14 (2) For a Class B misdemeanor, the sentence shall not exceed
- 15 ninety (90) days;
- 16 (3) For a Class C misdemeanor, the sentence shall not exceed
- 17 thirty (30) days; and
- 18 (4) For an unclassified misdemeanor, the sentence shall be in
- 19 accordance with a limitation of the statute defining the misdemeanor.
- 20 (c) A person eighteen (18) years of age or older who commits a felony
- 21 involving violence in which the finder of fact finds under § 5-4-110 that the
- 22 person committed the felony involving violence for the purpose of preventing
- 23 a person from exercising a constitutional right is subject to the following
- 24 <u>sentencing ranges:</u>

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- 25 <u>(1) For a Class A felony, the sentence shall be not less than</u>
- 26 ten (10) years nor more than thirty (30) years;
- 27 (2) For a Class B felony, the sentence shall be not less than
- 28 six (6) years nor more than twenty (20) years;
- 29 (3) For a Class C felony, the sentence shall be not less than
- 30 four (4) years nor more than ten (10) years; and
- 31 <u>(4) For a Class D felony, the sentence shall be not less than</u>
- 32 three (3) years nor more than six (6) years.
- 34 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code Title 12, Chapter 1, is amended to add an
- 35 additional section to read as follows:
- 36 <u>12-1-103. Data collection Civil rights criminal offense.</u>

1	(a) As used in this section, "civil rights criminal offense" means an
2	offense that resulted in a conviction and a finding under § 5-4-110 that the
3	person committed the offense for the purpose of preventing a person from
4	exercising his or her constitutional right.
5	(b)(1) The Attorney General shall establish and maintain a central
6	repository for the collection, analysis, and dissemination of civil rights
7	criminal offense data.
8	(2) The Division of Arkansas State Police and the Arkansas Crime
9	Information Center shall assist the Attorney General with the establishment
10	of the central repository described in subdivision (b)(1) of this section.
11	(c)(1) Each law enforcement agency shall submit a quarterly report to
12	the Attorney General concerning the commission of civil rights criminal
13	offenses within the law enforcement agency's jurisdiction.
14	(2) The quarterly report required under subdivision (c)(1) of
15	this section shall contain without limitation the following information, if
16	known:
17	(A) All relevant demographic information concerning the
18	<pre>suspect;</pre>
19	(B) All relevant demographic information concerning the
20	victim, including a specific reference to the constitutional right that the
21	law enforcement agency believes led to the commission of the civil rights
22	criminal offense;
23	(C) The status or outcome of the criminal investigation
24	or, if applicable, criminal prosecution; and
25	(D) A summary of the civil rights criminal offense,
26	including all relevant information known at the time of submission of the
27	quarterly report.
28	(d) Data concerning a civil rights criminal offense maintained in the
29	central repository shall be disseminated upon request to a:
30	(1) Federal, state, or local law enforcement agency;
31	(2) Political subdivision of the state; or
32	(3) State agency.
33	(e) The Attorney General shall publish on December 1 of each year a
34	summary and report of the data required to be collected and maintained under
35	this section, and the annual summary and report shall be delivered to the:
36	(1) Governor;
