12	AN ACT TO PROHIBIT MANDATORY CORONAVIRUS 2019 (COVID-
13	19) IMMUNIZATIONS OR VACCINATIONS FOR STUDENTS AND
14	EMPLOYEES; TO PROHIBIT A REQUIREMENT FOR A
15	VACCINATION OR IMMUNIZATION FOR CORONAVIRUS 2019
16	(COVID-19) EXCEPT IN CERTAIN CONDITIONS; TO DECLARE
17	AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

20	Subtitle
21	TO PROHIBIT MANDATORY COVID-19
22	IMMUNIZATIONS OR VACCINATIONS FOR
23	STUDENTS AND EMPLOYEES AND A REQUIREMENT
24	FOR A VACCINATION OR IMMUNIZATION FOR
25	COVID-19 EXCEPT IN CERTAIN CONDITIONS;
26	AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.
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29	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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31	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-18-702(a), concerning immunizations for
32	students in elementary and secondary schools, is amended to read as follows:
33	(a) <u>(1)</u> Except as otherwise provided by law, no <u>an</u> infant or child
34	shall <u>not</u> be admitted to a public or private school or childcare facility of
35	this state who <u>if he or she</u> has not been age-appropriately immunized from
36	poliomyelitis, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, red (rubeola) measles,



1	rubella, and other diseases as designated by the State Board of Health, as
2	evidenced by a certificate of a licensed physician or a public health
3	department acknowledging the immunization.
4	(2)(A) However, a public or private school or childcare facility
5	of this state shall not require or mandate an infant or child to receive an
6	immunization or vaccine for the coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) in order to be
7	admitted to a public or private school or childcare facility of this state.
8	(B) Subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this section shall expire ten
9	(10) years from the effective date of this act.
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11	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 11, Chapter 5, is amended to add an
12	additional subchapter to read as follows:
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14	<u>Subchapter 6 — Prohibition on Mandatory Vaccination for Coronavirus 2019</u>
15	<u>(COVID-19)</u>
16	
17	11-5-601. Definitions.
18	As used in this subchapter:
19	(1) "Coerce" means:
20	(A) The use of physical violence, threats, intimidation,
21	or retaliation with the purpose of causing a reasonable individual of
22	ordinary susceptibilities to acquiesce when the individual otherwise would
23	not;
24	(B) The act of making conditional a private or public
25	benefit, including without limitation employment, promotion, or another
26	employment benefit, with the purpose of causing a reasonable individual of
27	ordinary susceptibilities to acquiesce when the individual otherwise would
28	not; or
29	(C) The use of any other means with the purpose of causing
30	<u>a reasonable individual of ordinary susceptibilities to acquiesce when the</u>
31	individual otherwise would not;
32	(2) "Employee" means a person who:
33	(A) Is employed by an employer; or
34	(B) Contracts to perform certain work away from an
35	employer's premises, uses his or her own methods to accomplish the work, and
36	is subject to the control of the employer only as to the results of performed

1	work; and
2	(3) "Employer" means:
3	(A) An individual, partnership, association, corporation,
4	commercial entity, this state, or a political subdivision of this state; or
5	(B) A person or a group that acts directly or indirectly
6	in the interest of or in relation to an individual, partnership, association,
7	corporation, commercial entity, this state, or a political subdivision of
8	this state.
9	
10	11-5-602. Prohibition on mandatory vaccination for coronavirus 2019
11	(COVID-19) - Immunity.
12	(a) An employer shall not require or mandate an employee to receive an
13	immunization or vaccination for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) as a condition of
14	employment.
15	(b) An employer shall not:
16	(1) Coerce an employee into consenting to receive an
17	immunization or vaccination for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19);
18	(2) Create a hostile work environment for an employee who does
19	not consent to receive an immunization or vaccination for coronavirus 2019
20	<u>(COVID-19);</u>
21	(3) Withhold the opportunity for career advancement from an
22	employee who does not consent to receiving an immunization or vaccination for
23	coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19);
24	(4) Withhold a salary, wage increase, insurance, or insurance
25	discounts from an employee who does not consent to receiving an immunization
26	or vaccination for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19); or
27	(5) Dismiss an employee without offering a reasonable
28	accommodation, if possible, based on the decision of the employee to withhold
29	consent to receiving an immunization or vaccination for coronavirus 2019
30	<u>(COVID-19).</u>
31	(c)(l) An employer is immune from civil liability for damages or
32	injuries resulting from exposure of an employee to coronavirus 2019 (COVID-
33	19) on the premises owned or operated by the employer.
34	(2) Immunity under this section does not apply to willful,
35	reckless, or intentional misconduct resulting in injury or damages or extend
36	to workers' compensation benefits paid by or on behalf of an employer to an

1	employee under the Workers' Compensation Law, § 11-9-101 et seq., or a
2	comparable workers' compensation law of another jurisdiction.
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4	<u>11-5-603. Sunset.</u>
5	This subchapter shall expire ten (10) years after the effective date of
6	this subchapter.
7	
8	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 7, Subchapter 1, is amended
9	to add an additional section to read as follows:
10	20-7-141. Prohibition on requirement for vaccination or immunization
11	<u>for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) — Definitions.</u>
12	(a) As used in this section:
13	(1) "Early learning center" means a child daycare center, Early
14	Head Start center, Head Start center, or stand-alone prekindergarten not
15	attached to a school;
16	(2) "Permanent disability" means a medically determined
17	condition, whether due to injury or disease, that is permanent and
18	substantially affects one (1) or more major life activities of an individual;
19	and
20	(3) "School" means:
21	(A) An elementary school;
22	(B) A secondary school;
23	(C) A kindergarten;
24	(D) A college;
25	(E) A university;
26	(F) A proprietary school; or
27	(G) A vocational school.
28	(b) If a vaccine or immunization for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19)
29	approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration is not available,
30	an individual is not required to receive a vaccination or immunization for
31	coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19):
32	(1) For enrollment in a school or early learning center;
33	(2) As a condition of employment; or
34	(3) As a condition for obtaining a licensure, certificate, or
35	permit.
36	(c) If a vaccine or immunization for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19)

1	approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration is available, an
2	individual is not required to receive a vaccination or immunization for
3	coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) for the circumstances described in subdivisions
4	(b)(1)-(3) of this section unless:
5	(1) The vaccination or immunization is evaluated for any
6	potential risk of harm to cause cancer, impair fertility, or mutate genes;
7	(2) The safety of the vaccination or immunization is evaluated
8	for at least one (1) year after the vaccination or immunization is
9	administered through a clinical trial against a control group in which the
10	members receive either the vaccination or immunization or an inert placebo
11	that is approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration;
12	(3) Studies are conducted to identify any potential injury or
13	disease that may be caused by the vaccination or immunization or any injury
14	or disease that the vaccination or immunization may cause when administered
15	with other required or recommended vaccinations or immunizations;
16	(4) The risk of permanent disability or death from receiving the
17	vaccination or immunization is proven to be less than the infection rate
18	associated with coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19); and
19	(5) The manufacturer of the vaccination or immunization is
20	liable for any claim of injury or death caused by the vaccination or
21	immunization.
22	(d) An individual is not required to receive a vaccination or
23	immunization for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) if he or she submits a written
24	statement from a physician to the Department of Health or to his or her
25	employer, stating that the procedure:
26	(1) Is contradicted for a medical reason;
27	(2) Is against a religious or philosophical reason; or
28	(3) Is against the objection of a parent or guardian if the
29	individual is a minor.
30	(e)(1) The department shall maintain information and data about the
31	safety and efficacy of any vaccination or immunization for coronavirus 2019
32	(COVID-19) approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration,
33	including without limitation information and data on any risk of harm
34	associated with the administration of the vaccination or immunization, on the
35	department's website.
36	(2) The information and data described in subdivision (e)(1) of

1	this section shall be presented in a manner that is understandable and
2	accessible to all individuals.
3	(f) An individual shall not be discriminated against or coerced in any
4	way for refusing to receive a vaccination or immunization for coronavirus
5	<u>2019 (COVID-19).</u>
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7	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 20-78-206(a)(2)(A), concerning the rules
8	promulgated by the Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education
9	within the Childcare Facility Licensing Act, is amended to read as follows:
10	(2)(A)(i) However, no <u>a</u> childcare facility shall <u>not</u> continue to
11	admit a child who has not been age-appropriately immunized from
12	poliomyelitis, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, red (rubeola) measles,
13	rubella, and any other diseases as designated by the State Board of Health
14	within fifteen (15) program days after the child's original admission.
15	(ii) <u>(a)</u> The immunization shall be evidenced by a
16	certificate of a licensed physician or a public health department
17	acknowledging the immunization.
18	(b) The division shall consult with the
19	Secretary of the Department of Education or his or her designated
20	representative in regard to rules relating to education.
21	(iii)(a) However, a childcare facility shall not
22	require or mandate an infant or child to receive an immunization or vaccine
23	for the coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) in order to be admitted to a childcare
24	facility.
25	(b) Subdivision (a)(2)(A)(iii)(a) of this
26	section shall expire ten (10) years from the effective date of this act.
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28	SECTION 5. DO NOT CODIFY. ARKANSAS CODE REVISION COMMISSION
29	AUTHORIZATION.
30	The Arkansas Code Revision Commission is directed to remove this act
31	from the Arkansas Code upon the expiration of the terms of this act.
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33	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
34	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that in December 2020, several
35	vaccines or immunizations for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) were approved for
36	distribution to the citizens of the United States; that the State of Arkansas

1	has received limited quantities of vaccines or immunizations for coronavirus
2	2019 (COVID-19) and plans to make vaccinations or immunizations for
3	<u>coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) available to citizens of this state through a</u>
4	phased process; that citizens of this state have expressed concerns about
5	being forced to receive a vaccination or immunization for coronavirus 2019
6	(COVID-19) without consideration of their religious, philosophical, or
7	medical reasons or information about the safety of a vaccine or immunization
8	for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19); and that this act is immediately necessary
9	to protect the safety and health of the citizens of this state who have
10	religious, philosophical, or medical reasons for not receiving a vaccination
11	or immunization for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) or who have concerns about
12	the safety of a vaccine or immunization for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19).
13	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately
14	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
15	become effective on:
16	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
17	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
18	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
19	bill; or
20	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
21	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
