36	Subchapter 1 -	General Provisions.	

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2	12-20-101. Definitions.		
3	As used in this chapter:		
4	(1) "Control" means that a private school or private college or		
5	university is maintained on the property or rents or leases the property to		
6	facilitate events or functions of the private school or private college or		
7	university;		
8	(2) "Executive head" means the president or governing board of a		
9	private school or private college or university;		
10	(3) "Private college or university" means a college, university,		
11	or teaching hospital that has all of the following characteristics:		
12	(A) Is not owned or controlled by the state or a political		
13	subdivision of the state;		
14	(B) Provides a program of education in residence leading		
15	to a baccalaureate degree or provides a program of education in residence for		
16	which the baccalaureate degree is a prerequisite, leading to an academic or		
17	professional degree;		
18	(C) Is accredited by the North Central Association of		
19	Colleges and Schools Higher Learning Commission or another nationally		
20	recognized agency that accredits private colleges and universities; and		
21	(D) Has its principal place of business located in the		
22	state; and		
23	(4) "Private school" means a school offering instruction for		
24	students in grades kindergarten through twelve (K-12) in this state that is		
25	not a public school; and		
26	$\frac{(4)}{(5)}$ "Property" means both real property and personal property		
27	owned by or under the control of $\frac{1}{2}$ a private school or private college or		
28	university and includes without limitation all highways, streets, alleys, an		
29	rights-of-way that are contiguous or adjacent to real property owned by or		
30	under the control of the <u>private school or</u> private college or university.		
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32	12-20-102. Applicability — Cumulative effect.		
33	(a) This chapter applies to the property of each private school or		
34	private college or university.

(b) This chapter does not mean that a <u>private school or</u> private

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(c) This chapter is cumulative to any remedies that each <u>private</u> school or private college or university may possess for enforcing its rules and regulations, including its rights to impose sanctions through fees and charges and its rights to discipline, deny service, and expel.

12-20-103. Enforcement.

The prosecuting attorney or the city attorney, as may be appropriate, shall appear and prosecute in court all criminal offenses arising under this chapter.

Subchapter 2 - Law Enforcement Officers.

- 12-20-201. Appointment and removal of <u>private school or</u> private college or university law enforcement officers.
- 15 (a) An executive head of a <u>private school or private college or</u>
  16 university may appoint one (1) or more of the employees of the <u>private school</u>
  17 <u>or private college or university as a <u>private school or private college</u> or
  18 university law enforcement officer for the <u>private school or private college</u>
  19 or university, who shall exercise law enforcement officer authority under the
  20 laws of this state.</u>
- 21 (b) A <u>private school or private college or university law enforcement</u>
  22 officer shall:
  - (1) Have all the powers, duties, and obligations provided under the law for municipal police departments and county sheriffs, to be exercised as required for the protection of the <u>private school or</u> private college or university, together with any other duties that may be assigned by the employing <u>private school or</u> private college or university; and
  - (2) Meet the requirements for certification set out by the Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training in addition to any <u>private school or</u> private college or university requirements.
  - (c)(1) The jurisdictional powers or responsibilities of a county sheriff or municipal police department over the property of a <u>private school or private college</u> or university or a person on the property of a <u>private school or private college</u> or university are not ceded to a <u>private school or private college</u> or university law enforcement officer.
  - (2) The appointment or designation of <u>private school or</u> private

- 1 college or university law enforcement officers does not supersede the
- 2 authority of the Department Division of Arkansas State Police, a county
- 3 sheriff, or a municipal police department of the jurisdiction within which
- 4 the property of the private school or private college or university, or
- 5 portions of it, is located.

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- (d)(1) A <u>private school or</u> private college or university law enforcement officer shall be identified by a shield or badge bearing the name of the private school or private college or university.
- 9 (2) The <u>private school or</u> private college or university shall
  10 issue an identification card bearing the photograph of the <u>private school or</u>
  11 private college or university law enforcement officer who shall carry it on
  12 his or her person at all times when on duty and display it upon request.
  - (e)(1) A <u>private school or</u> private college or university law enforcement officer's authorization to have and to exercise the powers provided by law for law enforcement officers shall be further evidenced by a letter of appointment issued under the seal of the <u>private school or</u> private college or university.
  - (2) The executive head of the <u>private school or</u> private college or university shall maintain a file containing each <u>private school or</u> private college or university law enforcement officer's letter of appointment and all other certificates and information consistent with the rules of the commission.
    - (3)(A) The executive head of the <u>private school or</u> private college or university or the <u>department division</u> may revoke in writing the appointment to serve as a <u>private school or</u> private college or university law enforcement officer for the <u>private school or</u> private college or university.
    - (B) Upon revocation as described in subdivision (e)(3)(A) of this section, the person shall not possess or exercise the authority of a private school or private college or university law enforcement officer.
- 30 (C) A copy of all revocations shall be placed into the 31 file described in subdivision (e)(2) of this section.
- 32 (D) A <u>private school or private college or university</u>
  33 employing a <u>private school or private college or university law enforcement</u>
  34 officer shall notify the commission of any change in the <u>private school or</u>
  35 private college or university law enforcement officer's status within three
  36 (3) days.

(f) A <u>private school or</u> private college or university law enforcement officer shall not be reimbursed with state funds for any training he or she receives or be eligible to participate in any state or municipal retirement system.

- 12-20-202. Private <u>school or private</u> college or university law enforcement officer's duties and powers Definition.
- (a) A <u>private school or</u> private college or university law enforcement officer's primary jurisdiction is the <u>private school or</u> private college or university employing him or her, and except to the extent otherwise limited by the executive head of the <u>private school or</u> private college or university appointing him or her, the <u>private school or</u> private college or university law enforcement officer shall:
- 14 (1) Protect property;
  - (2) Preserve and maintain proper order and decorum;
- 16 (3) Prevent unlawful assemblies, disorderly conduct, and trespass;
- 18 (4) Exclude and eject persons detrimental to the well-being of 19 the <u>private school or private college</u> or university; and
- 20 (5) Regulate the operation and parking of motor vehicles upon 21 property of the private school or private college or university.
  - (b)(1) A <u>private school or</u> private college or university law enforcement officer shall exercise police supervision on behalf of the <u>private school or</u> private college or university and may arrest any person in the <u>private school or</u> private college or university law enforcement officer's primary jurisdiction who is committing an offense against any law of the State of Arkansas or against the ordinances of the city or county in which the <u>private school or</u> private college or university is located.
    - (2) A <u>private school or private college</u> or university law enforcement officer may summon a posse comitatus if necessary to complete an arrest under subdivision (b)(1) of this section.
- 32 (c) A <u>private school or</u> private college or university law enforcement
  33 officer may make an arrest for an offense against any law of the State of
  34 Arkansas outside his or her primary jurisdiction if the <u>private school or</u>
  35 private college or university law enforcement officer is:
  - (1) Summoned by another law enforcement agency to provide

1 assistance; 2 (2) Assisting another law enforcement agency; 3 (3) Exercising his or her police powers in accordance with a 4 written mutual aid agreement or memorandum of understanding between the 5 private school or private college or university and the municipality or 6 county within which the private school or private college or university is 7 located; or 8 (4)(A) Traveling to or from any location in the state on 9 official business. 10 (B) As used in subdivision (c)(4)(A) of this section, 11 "official business" includes without limitation: 12 Engaging in intelligence-gathering activity 13 relating to security on the property of the private school or private college 14 or university employing him or her; 15 (ii) Investigating a crime committed on the property 16 of the private school or private college or university employing him or her; 17 (iii) Transporting money, valuables, securities, or 18 other valuables on behalf of the private school or private college or university employing him or her; 19 20 (iv) Providing security or protective services for 21 officials or visiting dignitaries to the private school or private college or 22 university employing him or her; or 23 (v) Continuously and immediately pursuing a person 24 for an offense committed on the property of the private school or private 25 college or university employing him or her or in the private school or 26 private college or university law enforcement officer's eyesight. 27 (d)(1) When a private school or private college or university law 28 enforcement officer makes an arrest outside his or her primary jurisdiction, 29 the private school or private college or university law enforcement officer shall promptly notify the law enforcement agency with jurisdiction and 30 31 forward a written report to the law enforcement agency with jurisdiction no 32 later than the next working day. 33 (2) The law enforcement agency having jurisdiction may choose to 34 conduct the investigation or allow the private school or private college or

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8	Subchapter 3 - Motor Vehicle Regulation.
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10	12-20-301. Rules and regulations for motor vehicles on <u>private school</u>
11	or private college or university grounds.
12	(a)(l) Each private school or private college or university may
13	promulgate and amend rules and regulations for the operation and parking of
14	motor vehicles on its property as its governing board deems necessary if the
15	rules and regulations do not conflict with governing state law or a city or
16	county ordinance.
17	(2) The rules and regulations described in subdivision (a)(1) of
18	this section may be submitted to the city or county where the property of the
19	<u>private school or</u> private college or university is located for adoption as
20	ordinances, including without limitation ordinances that:
21	(A) Limit the rate of speed; and
22	(B) Enforce other traffic rules, including control and
23	direction of traffic.
24	(b) Speed limits shall be posted at reasonable intervals, and traffic
25	and parking directions and prohibitions shall be indicated by signs.
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
