22	SECTION 1. Ar	kansas Code § 8-4-203(b)(1)(B), concerni	ng permits for
23	nonmunicipal domesti	c sewage treatment works, is amended to	read as follows:
24	(B	3) As used in this section, "nonmunicipa	l domestic sewage
25	treatment works" mea	ans a device or system operated by an ent	ity other than a
26	city, town, or count	y, public facilities board, or public wa	ter authority
27	that treats, in whol	e or in part, waste or wastewater from h	numans or
28	household operations	s and must continuously operate to protec	t human health
29	and the environment	despite a permittee's failure to maintai	n or operate the
30	device or system.

32	SECTION 2. EM	MERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determi	ned by the
33	-	the State of Arkansas that certain publi	
34	_	ter authorities operate domestic sewage	-
35	that protect the hea	alth and safety of the public; that under	<u>current law</u>
36	these public entitie	es are treated like a city, town, or coun	ity for purposes

1	of operating domestic sewage treatment systems; that the current law will		
2	expire on June 30, 2020; that the expiration of the current law could disrup		
3	the operations of those public facilities boards and public water		
4	authorities; and that this act is immediately necessary to prevent any		
5	disruption of the operation of those domestic sewage treatment systems that		
6	protect the health and safety of the public. Therefore, an emergency is		
7	declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the		
8	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective		
9	on:		
10	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
11	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
12	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
13	<pre>bill; or</pre>		
14	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
15	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
