22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - FEDERAL FUNDS. It is the specific intent of the General Assembly that in the event of the availability of federal funding for the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services during the fiscal year ending June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022, that such funding be utilized to conserve or reduce the expenditure of general revenue except where prohibited by law.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~ 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES. Pay rates for physicians and chief psychologists within the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services may include the special allowances available to UAMS physicians and professional faculty as described in the special language of the UAMS appropriation. Part of the salaries of such staff will come from the receipt of professional income in the care of patients and/or funds received from federal agencies, foundations and other private sponsors in the support of research. Provided that any such allowance shall not exceed, for any employee, an amount equal to two and one half times the salary authorized by the General Assembly. The specific Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services classifications covered by this language are:

- Class
- Code Title
- L005N Psychiatric Specialist
- L009N DHS Behavioral Health General Physician
- L001C Psychologist Supervisor

Prior to these allowances being made available for an individual, they will be approved by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and reviewed by the Personnel Committee of the Arkansas Legislative Council or the Joint Budget

1 Committee.

5 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
7 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - VOCATIONAL TRAINEES. The Division of Aging,  
8 Adult, and Behavioral Health Services of the Department of Human Services is  
9 hereby authorized to provide employment opportunities for some of the working  
10 residents who are separate from the currently authorized regular vocational  
11 trainee positions. The positions authorized herein shall not be incorporated  
12 into the present classification system but shall be provided for by each  
13 Community Mental Health Center or the State Hospital, on a cash account  
14 basis. It is the intent of the General Assembly that the authorization of  
15 these positions shall facilitate the Agency's ability to provide for  
16 residents who are not part of a regular vocational training program.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~  
18 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

20 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
22 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - JOB SHARE. The Division of Aging, Adult, and  
23 Behavioral Health Services can utilize job share for positions within the  
24 nursing classification (RN, LPN/LPTN, BHA/CNA) for up to 24 hours per week  
25 per individual. This will allow the Division to offer weekend option shifts  
26 to nursing personnel without increasing the number of positions.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~  
28 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

29

30 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
32 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - STATE HOSPITAL CONTINGENCY POSITIONS. If the  
33 Department of Human Services determines, and after prior review by the  
34 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, it shall be determined that it  
35 is in the best interest of the State of Arkansas to discontinue a management  
36 contract with a private provider and it is deemed necessary to utilize

1 Department staff to provide the required services, the ~~Director~~ Secretary of  
 2 the Department of Human Services may request the ~~Department of Finance and~~  
 3 ~~Administration~~ Department of Transformation and Shared Services to approve  
 4 the establishment of one or more additional positions at salary rates not to  
 5 exceed the maximum salaries established for comparable positions in the  
 6 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, the Department of Human  
 7 Services' Appropriation Act, and the University of Arkansas for Medical  
 8 Sciences' Appropriation Act. Upon approval by the ~~Department of Finance and~~  
 9 ~~Administration~~ Department of Transformation and Shared Services and after  
 10 review by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, the Department  
 11 of Human Services - Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services  
 12 may establish such positions.

13 If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as  
 14 established herein, the position(s) must be requested as a new position(s) in  
 15 the agency's budget request.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~  
 17 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

18  
 19 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS  
 21 HEALTH CENTER. (A) The Department of Human Services shall not close the  
 22 Arkansas Health Center that provides skilled nursing through specialized  
 23 services and programs.

24 (B) The Department of Human Services shall continue to accept clients for  
 25 whom it has determined that skilled nursing and specialized services are  
 26 needed at the Arkansas Health Center.

27 (C) No funds shall be transferred or reduced from the Arkansas Health  
 28 Center, except for use as federal matching funds, below the approved funding  
 29 level on March 1, 2003 without the prior approval of the Arkansas Legislative  
 30 Council or the Joint Budget Committee.

31 (D) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation and general revenue  
 32 funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General  
 33 Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the  
 34 appropriation act(s) for a state agency and the general revenue allocations  
 35 authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue  
 36 Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the

1 Department of Human Services may operate more efficiently if some flexibility  
2 is provided to the Department of Human Services authorizing broad powers  
3 under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the  
4 General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the  
5 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section.  
6 The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget  
7 Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of  
8 approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled  
9 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is  
10 void.

11 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~

14 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA  
16 HELP – BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES. Employees in extra-help positions at the  
17 Department of Human Services – Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral  
18 Health Services may receive an amount not to exceed eighty-five percent (85%)  
19 of the maximum annual salary for a comparable position as authorized under §  
20 21-5-201 et seq. during any fiscal year, nor shall such an employee be  
21 employed for a period of time to exceed one thousand eight hundred (1,800)  
22 hours in any single fiscal year.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2020~~  
24 2021 through June 30, ~~2021~~ 2022.

25  
26 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
28 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - PROCEEDS FOR SALES OF TIMBER AND HAY - CAPITAL  
29 IMPROVEMENTS AND EQUIPMENT. The Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral  
30 Health Services is authorized to use the administrative operating account for  
31 capital improvements to the physical plant, and for the purchase of capital  
32 equipment, and for the operation of the Arkansas Health Center, operated by  
33 the Department of Human Services - Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral  
34 Health Services. The funds shall be held by the Department of Human Services  
35 - Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services, from the proceeds  
36 of the sale of timber and hay that may be harvested from land owned by the

1 Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services. All funds deposited  
 2 and all expenses shall be tracked separately. The harvesting of timber and  
 3 hay is specifically authorized to provide funds to finance capital  
 4 improvements to the physical plant, for the purchase of major capital  
 5 equipment, and for the operation of the Arkansas Health Center. The Division  
 6 of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services shall report all income

 19 RATES OF PAY AND EMPLOYMENT WORK DAYS. For employees hired on or after July  
 20 1, 2013, at the Arkansas State Hospital in the classifications listed below,  
 21 the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services Director shall  
 22 implement salary adjustments utilizing the approved pay grid for teachers  
 23 employed by the Arkansas Schools for the Blind and Deaf.

24 To achieve the salary adjustments, the Division of Aging, Adult, and  
 25 Behavioral Health Services is authorized to pay special rates of pay for  
 26 classifications at the Arkansas State Hospital listed below:

30 Funding for the minimum compensation provided for in this section that  
 31 is supported in whole or in part from general revenues, shall, if required,  
 32 be provided by a transfer from the Performance Fund to the proper fund or  
 33 fund account and in such amounts as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of  
 34 the State. The Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services  
 35 shall in addition to the funds provided in this Act for Annual Career Service  
 36 Recognition Payments from the Performance Fund, make available any funding

1 generated from agency salary savings for such purposes from the funds or fund  
2 accounts as provided by law.

3 For employees hired on or after July 1, 2013, at the Arkansas State

21 leave, as of June 30, 2013, shall be retained on file and shall be exhausted  
22 before any newly accrued sick leave may be taken.

23 All employees affected by this section shall be eligible to receive  
24 hazardous duty pay for time worked in eligible areas.

28 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

30 FORWARD - COMMUNITY BASED CRISIS INTERVENTION. Any unexpended balance of  
31 funds allocated for Community Based Crisis Intervention in the Department of  
32 Human Services - Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services  
33 from the Behavioral Health Services Fund Account which remains at the close  
34 of each state fiscal year shall be carried forward to the next state fiscal  
35 year to be used for the same intent and purposes as set forth in law. Any  
36 carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein may be

1 carried forward under the following conditions:

2 (1) Prior to June 30, ~~2020~~ 2021, the Agency shall, by written  
3 statement, set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding  
4 to the Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

5 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall  
6 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the  
7 September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting  
8 which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or

29 ADULT SERVICES - MATCHING FUNDS. The funds appropriated for state match for  
30 the Arkansas Senior Olympics Program in this Act shall be paid on a two-to-  
31 one state/local matching basis. The Senior Arkansas Sports Organization must  
32 certify its portion of the match to the Division of Aging, Adult, and  
33 Behavioral Health Services before any funds appropriated for state match for  
34 the Arkansas Senior Olympics Program in this Act are disbursed.

 14 ADULT SERVICES - GRANT/CONTRACT DISBURSEMENT GUIDELINES. All appropriations

 16 and that are distributed under grant or contract methodologies may be  
 17 disbursed by the Department of Human Services in the same manner as  
 18 authorized under federal regulations for the disbursement of Title III Older  
 19 Americans Act funds. Otherwise, all disbursements shall comply with the

 28 Operations appropriation may be used for home delivered meals, adult day  
 29 care, homemaker/chore, respite care, personal care, health promotion, and  
 30 other community-based activities. These funds may also be used to match  
 31 Medicaid community-based programs.

1 CITIZEN CENTERS. The appropriation in this act for Senior Citizen Centers

5 monies currently funding services for Senior Citizen Centers.

17 FORWARD OF UNOBLIGATED GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS FOR SENIOR CITIZEN CENTERS. (a)  
18 On June 30, 2019, or as soon as is practicable to determine funds available  
19 as authorized in this Section, and each fiscal year thereafter the Chief  
20 Fiscal Officer of the State shall cause to be transferred on his or her books  
21 and those of the State Treasurer and Auditor of State the balance of  
22 unobligated general revenue funds, excluding funds carried forward for other  
23 purposes, remaining in the Fund or Fund Accounts and the corresponding paying  
24 accounts as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, as set out  
25 in subsection (b) herein, to the Department of Human Services - Division of  
26 Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services paying account to be used  
27 exclusively for the disbursement of funds for Senior Citizen Centers in the

30 (b) Any unobligated general revenue, excluding funds carried forward for  
31 other purposes, remaining in the following Fund or Fund Accounts and the  
32 corresponding paying accounts at the end of the Fiscal Year that would  
33 normally be transferred into the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund as  
34 recouped or recovered General Revenue shall be transferred as authorized in  
35 subsection (a) herein:

36 (1) Department of Human Services Administration Fund Account;

- 1 (2) Children and Family Services Fund Account;
- 2 (3) Child Care and Early Childhood Education Fund Account;
- 3 (4) Youth Services Fund Account;
- 4 (5) Developmental Disabilities Services Fund Account;

- 6 (7) Behavioral Health Services Fund Account;
- 7 (8) County Operations Fund Account; and
- 8 (9) Provider Services and Quality Assurance Fund Account.

9 (c)(1) Any general revenue recouped or recovered as authorized in  
10 subsections (a) and (b) herein shall be carried forward to the following  
11 fiscal year for Senior Citizen Centers and shall be distributed in the same  
12 manner as the funding formula requirements set out in the federal Older  
13 Americans Act funding law.

14 (2) The additional funding provided by this provision shall supplement  
15 and not supplant any monies currently funding services for Senior Citizen  
16 Centers.

17 (d) Should additional funding provided for in subsections (a) and (b)  
18 herein be insufficient to provide for the full five hundred thousand dollars  
19 (\$500,000) authorized, the increases shall be provided to the extent that  
20 general revenue is recouped and carried forward.

21 (e)(1) The Department of Human Services shall provide a written report to  
22 the Department of Finance and Administration Budget Office, the Arkansas  
23 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee the total amount of general  
24 revenue carried forward and distributed as set forth in this section no later  
25 than thirty (30) days prior to the time the Department presents its budget  
26 request to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.

27 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration shall include all  
28 information obtained in subsection (e)(1) herein in the budget manual  
29 submitted to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee for  
30 the Department.

31  
32 SECTION 28. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds  
33 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency  
34 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and  
35 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and  
36 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

1 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal  
2 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by  
3 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be  
4 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

5  
6 SECTION 29. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
7 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
8 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
9 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
10 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
11 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
12 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
13 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.  
14

15 SECTION 30. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
16 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits  
17 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
18 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2021 is essential to the operation of  
19 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
20 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
21 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2021 could work irreparable harm  
22 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
23 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
24 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health  
25 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021.  
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
