29	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code	§ 15-42-104 is amended t	o read as follows:
30	15-42-104. Hunting and f	ishing licenses for resid	lents — Special fees.
31	(a)(1) The maximum fee for the annual resident basic hunting license		
32	for any resident of the State of Arkansas who is sixteen (16) years of age or		
33	older for the privilege of taking small game and the taking of one (1) deer		
34	by the use of a modern center-fire firearm shall be as provided by the		
35	regulations and within the bag limits promulgated by the Arkansas State Game		
36	and Fish Commission but shall not exceed eleven dollars and fifty cents		

- 1 (\$11.50) each until July 1, 1997, when the maximum fee shall revert to ten
  2 dollars and fifty cents (\$10.50) fifteen dollars (\$15.00).
- 3 (2) The maximum fee for the annual resident sportsman hunting
  4 license for any resident of the State of Arkansas who is sixteen (16) years
  5 of age or older for the privilege of taking three (3) the legal bag limit of
  6 deer and all other game by any method of taking shall be as provided by the
  7 regulations and within the bag limits promulgated by the commission but shall
  8 not exceed twenty-six dollars (\$26.00) each until July 1, 1997, when the
  9 maximum fee shall revert to twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) thirty-two dollars
- 11 (3) In addition to the annual resident basic and sportsman
  12 hunting license fees authorized in this subsection, the commission by
  13 regulation may provide that any resident of this state who is sixteen (16)
  14 years of age or older be required:
- 15 (A) For <u>for</u> the privilege of hunting migratory birds in this state, to obtain a <del>special</del>:
- (A) Special permit and pay a special annual fee not to exceed seven dollars (\$7.00) ten dollars (\$10.00) each; and
- 19 <u>(B) Federally required Harvest Information Program</u>
- 20 <u>registration.</u>

- 21 (B) For the privilege of taking a bonus deer in addition
  22 to the deer authorized with the basic hunting license and the sportsman
  23 hunting license, to obtain a special permit and pay a special fee not to
  24 exceed ten dollars (\$10.00) each; and
  - (C) For the privilege of hunting elk in this state, to obtain a special permit and pay a special annual fee not to exceed thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) each.
  - (4) Nothing contained herein is intended to restrict the authority of the commission to charge any resident of the state an additional fee solely for the purpose of entering upon and hunting upon any land owned or leased by the commission.
- 32 (b)(1) The maximum fee for the annual resident fishing license for any
  33 resident of the State of Arkansas who is sixteen (16) years of age or older
  34 shall be as provided by the regulations promulgated by the commission but
  35 shall not exceed eleven dollars and fifty cents (\$11.50) each until July 1,
  36 1997, when the maximum fee shall revert to ten dollars and fifty cents

- 1 (\$10.50) fifteen dollars (\$15.00) each.
- 2 (2) In addition to the annual resident fishing license fee 3 authorized in this subsection, the commission by regulation may provide that 4 any resident of this state sixteen (16) years of age or older be required for
- 5 the privilege of fishing for trout in this state to obtain a special permit,
- 6 <u>also known as a trout stamp</u>, and pay a special annual fee not to exceed ten 7 dollars (\$10.00).
- 8 (3) In lieu of the annual resident fishing license fee 9 authorized in this subsection, the commission by regulation may provide that
- 10 any resident of this state sixteen (16) years of age or older be authorized
- 11 to purchase a three-day-trip fishing license for a fee not to exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$

dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) each until July 1, 1997, when the maximum fee

- 13 shall revert to six dollars and fifty cents (\$6.50) ten dollars (\$10.00)
- 14 each.

- 15 (c) The maximum fee for the annual resident combination sportsman
- 16 hunting and fishing license for any resident of the State of Arkansas who is
- 17 sixteen (16) years of age or older for all hunting and fishing privileges
- 18 except those covered by the migratory bird waterfowl and trout permits shall
- 19 be as provided by the regulations and within the bag limits as promulgated by
- 20 the commission but shall not exceed thirty-seven dollars and fifty cents
- 21 (\$37.50) each until July 1, 1997, when the maximum fee shall revert to
- 22 thirty-five dollars and fifty cents (\$35.50) forty-two dollars (\$42.00) each.
- 23 (d)(1) The commission:
- 24 (A) Shall provide for the issuance of a lifetime hunting
- 25 and fishing license, with an optional lifetime trout stamp permit and
- 26 lifetime state duck stamp waterfowl permit, to a resident of this state who
- 27 is:
- 28 (i) Sixty-five (65) years of age or older for a one-
- 29 time fee of thirty-five dollars and fifty cents (\$35.50) forty-two dollars
- 30 <u>(\$42.00)</u>;
- 31 (ii) Any age Eighteen (18) years of age or under for
- 32 a one-time fee of one thousand dollars (\$1,000); or
- 33 (iii) Nineteen (19) years of age or older for a one-
- 34 time fee of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500); or
- 35 (iii)(iv) Sixty (60) years of age or older who is a
- 36 regular or nonregular retiree of the armed services of the United States for

for a fee that shall not exceed thirty-five dollars and fifty cents (\$35.50).

1	(e) For this section, the commission may promutgate rules that:		
2	(1) Define "resident" and "totally disabled"; and		
3	(2) Govern the sale and use of each license, permit, or stamp		
4	issued under this section+; and		
5	(3) Periodically adjust the fee for each license, permit, or		
6	stamp under subsections (a)-(d) of this section if the fee increases for each		
7	license, permit, or stamp do not exceed the Consumer Price Index for All		
8	Urban Consumers (CPI-U), rounded up to the next whole dollar over the period		
9	of time since the last fee adjustment or change.		
10	(f) Beginning July 1, 2022, the commission shall provide a semiannual		
11	report to the Game and Fish/State Police Subcommittee of the Legislative		
12	Council for administrative review of the total amount of increased license,		
13	permit, and stamp fees collected each fiscal year.
