LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 8 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 9 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 10 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 11 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 12 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 13 14 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 15 16 SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 17 Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of the University of Arkansas - Fort Smith are, due to unforeseen circumstances, 18 19 insufficient for the University of Arkansas - Fort Smith to continue to 20 provide essential governmental services; that the provisions of this act will provide the necessary monies for the University of Arkansas - Fort Smith to 21 22 continue such services; and that a delay in the effective date of this Act 23 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared 24 25 to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the 26 public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and 27 after the date of its passage and approval. 28 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall 29 become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the 30 Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house 31 32 overrides the veto. 33 34 35
