6 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - STATE HOSPITAL CONTINGENCY POSITIONS. If the 8 Department of Human Services determines, and after prior review by the 9 10 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, it shall be determined that it 11 is in the best interest of the State of Arkansas to discontinue a management 12 contract with a private provider and it is deemed necessary to utilize 13 Department staff to provide the required services, the Secretary of the 14 Department of Human Services may request the Department of Transformation and 15 Shared Services to approve the establishment of one or more additional 16 positions at salary rates not to exceed the maximum salaries established for 17 comparable positions in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, the 18 Department of Human Services' Appropriation Act, and the University of 19 Arkansas for Medical Sciences' Appropriation Act. Upon approval by the 20 Department of Transformation and Shared Services and after review by the 21 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, the Department of Human 22 Services - Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services may 23 establish such positions.

If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as established herein, the position(s) must be requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

30 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS 32 HEALTH CENTER. (A) The Department of Human Services shall not close the 33 Arkansas Health Center that provides skilled nursing through specialized 34 services and programs.

35 (B) The Department of Human Services shall continue to accept clients for36 whom it has determined that skilled nursing and specialized services are

1 needed at the Arkansas Health Center.

2 (C) No funds shall be transferred or reduced from the Arkansas Health
3 Center, except for use as federal matching funds, below the approved funding
4 level on March 1, 2003 without the prior approval of the Arkansas Legislative
5 Council or the Joint Budget Committee.

6 (D) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation and general revenue 7 funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General 8 Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the 9 appropriation act(s) for a state agency and the general revenue allocations 10 authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue 11 Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the 12 Department of Human Services may operate more efficiently if some flexibility 13 is provided to the Department of Human Services authorizing broad powers 14 under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the 15 General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the 16 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. 17 The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 18 Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of 19 approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled 20 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 21 void.

1 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - PROCEEDS FOR SALES OF TIMBER AND HAY - CAPITAL 3 4 IMPROVEMENTS AND EQUIPMENT. The Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral 5 Health Services is authorized to use the administrative operating account for 6 capital improvements to the physical plant, and for the purchase of capital 7 equipment, and for the operation of the Arkansas Health Center, operated by 8 the Department of Human Services - Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral 9 Health Services. The funds shall be held by the Department of Human Services 10 - Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services, from the proceeds 11 of the sale of timber and hay that may be harvested from land owned by the 12 Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services. All funds deposited 13 and all expenses shall be tracked separately. The harvesting of timber and 14 hay is specifically authorized to provide funds to finance capital 15 improvements to the physical plant, for the purchase of major capital 16 equipment, and for the operation of the Arkansas Health Center. For employees hired on or after July 1, 2013, at the Arkansas State Hospital in the classifications listed below, the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services Director shall implement salary adjustments utilizing the approved pay grid for teachers employed by the Arkansas Schools for the Blind and Deaf.

35 To achieve the salary adjustments, the Division of Aging, Adult, and 36 Behavioral Health Services is authorized to pay special rates of pay for

5 Funding for the minimum compensation provided for in this section that 6 is supported in whole or in part from general revenues, shall, if required, 7 be provided by a transfer from the Performance Fund to the proper fund or 8 fund account and in such amounts as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of 9 the State. The Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services 10 shall in addition to the funds provided in this Act for Annual Career Service 11 Recognition Payments from the Performance Fund, make available any funding 12 generated from agency salary savings for such purposes from the funds or fund 13 accounts as provided by law.

10 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SENIOR 12 CITIZEN CENTERS. The appropriation in this act for Senior Citizen Centers 13 shall be distributed in the same manner as the funding formula requirements 14 set out in the federal Older Americans Act funding law. The additional 15 funding provided by this provision shall supplement and not supplant any 16 monies currently funding services for Senior Citizen Centers.

25 (2) The additional funding provided by this provision shall supplement 26 and not supplant any monies currently funding services for Senior Citizen 27 Centers.

28 (d) Should additional funding provided for in subsections (a) and (b) 29 herein be insufficient to provide for the full five hundred thousand dollars 30 (\$500,000) authorized, the increases shall be provided to the extent that 31 general revenue is recouped and carried forward.

(2) The Department of Finance and Administration shall include all
information obtained in subsection (e)(1) herein in the budget manual
submitted to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee for

7 SECTION 29. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 8 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 9 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 10 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 11 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 12 13 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 14 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 15 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

17 SECTION 30. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 18 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 19 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 20 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 21 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 22 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 23 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 24 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 25

SECTION 31. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act is effective on and after July 1, 2022.
