17	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the										
18	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the purpose of the sex										
19	offender registry is to give citizens the information that they need to										
20	protect themselves and their loved ones from dangerous sex offenders; the										
21	information in the sex offender registry is currently incomplete, resulting										
22	in citizens of this state living in danger; that providing complete										
23	information on dangerous sex offenders is necessary to ensure the citizens of										
24	this state can protect themselves and their loved ones; that every day,										
25	citizens of this state make decisions about where to live, work, play, and										
26	carry on other activities that potentially bring them into contact with										
27	dangerous sex offenders without their having the complete information to										
28	ensure their safety; and that this act is immediately necessary to ensure the										
29	protection of citizens of this state from dangerous sex offenders. Therefore,										
30	an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary										
31	for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become										
32	effective on:										
33	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
