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28	SECTION 1. DO	NOT CODIFY. Legislative findings and	d intent.
29	(a) The Genera	l Assembly finds that:	
30	<u>(1) Arka</u>	nsas Constitution, Article 2, § 3 pro	ovides that the
31	equality of all perso	ns before the law is recognized and	shall ever remain
32	inviolate;		
33	<u>(2) Arka</u>	nsas Constitution, Article 2, § 18 fo	urther provides that
34	the General Assembly	shall not grant to any citizen, or c	lass of citizens,
35	privileges or immunit	ies which, upon the same terms, shal	l not equally belong
36	to all citizens;		

1	(3) Section 1 of the Fourteenth Amendment of the United States
2	Constitution requires that "No State shall [] deny to any person within
3	its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws";
4	(4) Innocent human life, created in the image of God, should be
5	equally protected under the laws from the time of fertilization to natural
6	death;
7	(5) To ensure the right to life and equal protection of the
8	laws, all unborn children should be protected under the state homicide laws
9	as all other persons;
10	(6) All persons potentially subject to the state homicide laws
11	are entitled to due process protections; and
12	(7) A pregnant woman should be protected from being pressured
13	through solicitation, advisement, encouragement, or coercion to abort her
14	unborn child.
15	(b) The intent of this act is to add protections for unborn children,
16	allow appropriate prosecution when a person causes the death of an unborn
17	child, and repeal provisions that may allow a person to solicit, advise,
18	encourage, or coerce a pregnant woman to abort her unborn child.
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20	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 5-1-102(13), concerning the definition of
21	"person" in the Arkansas Criminal Code, is amended to read as follows:
22	(13)(A) "Person", "actor", "defendant", "he", "she", "her", or
23	"him" includes:
24	(i) Any natural person; and
25	(ii) When appropriate, an organization as defined in
26	§ 5-2-501.
27	(B)(i)(a) As used in $\S\S 5-10-101 - 5-10-105$ and $5-4-604$,
28	"person" also includes an unborn child in utero at any stage of development.
29	(b) "Unborn child" means offspring of human
30	beings from conception fertilization until birth.
31	(c) "Fertilization" means the fusion of a
32	human spermatozoon with a human ovum.
33	(ii) This subdivision (13)(B) does not apply to \underline{a}
34	lawful medical procedure:
35	(a) An act that causes the death of an unborn
36	child in utero if the act was committed during a legal abortion to which the

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1	woman consented, including an abortion performed to remove an ectopic	
2	pregnancy or other nonviable pregnancy when the embryo is not going to	
3	develop further;	
4	(b) An act that is committed pursuant to a	
5	usual and customary standard of medical practice during diagnostic testing or	
6	therapeutic treatment;	
7	(c) An act that is committed in the course of	
8	medical research, experimental medicine, or an act deemed necessary to save	
9	the life or preserve the health of the woman;	
10	(d) Assisted reproduction technology activity,	
11	procedure, or treatment; or	
12	(e) An act occurring before transfer to the	
13	uterus of the woman of an embryo created through in vitro fertilization.	
14	(a) Performed:	
15	(1) By a licensed physician;	
16	(2) On a pregnant woman to avert the	
17	death of the pregnant woman, including from an ectopic pregnancy; and	
18	(3) When all reasonable alternatives to	
19	save the life of the unborn child are unavailable or were attempted	
20	unsuccessfully before the performance of the medical procedure; and	
21	(b) That results in the accidental or	
22	unintentional death of the unborn child that the pregnant woman was carrying.	
23	(iii) Nothing in this subdivision (13)(B) shall be	
24	construed to allow the charging or conviction of a woman with any criminal	
25	offense in the death of her own unborn child in utero All provisions of the	
26	Arkansas Criminal Code apply to a prosecution for the death of an unborn	
27	child that would apply to a prosecution for the death of any other person,	
28	including any applicable presumptions, defenses, justifications, laws of	
29	parties, immunities, and clemencies.	
30	(iv) Subdivision (13)(B) does not authorize	
31	prosecution for an accidental miscarriage;

33	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 16-62-102(a), concerning wrongful death	
34	actions, is amended to read as follows:	
35	(a)(1) Whenever the death of a person, including Θr an unborn child as	
36	defined in § 5-1-102 is caused by a wrongful act neglect or default and	

- 1 the act, neglect, or default would have entitled the party injured to
- 2 maintain an action and recover damages in respect thereof if death had not
- 3 ensued, then and in every such case, the person or company or corporation
- 4 that would have been liable if death had not ensued shall be liable to an
- 5 action for damages, notwithstanding the death of the person, including or an
- 6 unborn child as defined in § 5-1-102, injured, and although the death may
- 7 have been caused under such circumstances as amount in law to a felony.
- 8 (2) The cause of action created in this subsection shall survive
- 9 the death of the person wrongfully causing the death of another and may be
- 10 brought, maintained, or revived against the personal representatives of the
- 11 person wrongfully causing the death of another.
- 12 (3) A person is not liable under this subsection when the death
- 13 of the unborn child results from:
- 14 (A) A legal abortion, including an abortion performed to

- 26 SECTION 4. DO NOT CODIFY. Applicability.
- 27 This act is prospective only and does not apply to conduct committed
- 28 before the effective date of this act.
- 30 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
- 31 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that unborn children are at risk of
- 32 being aborted in this state and are currently being denied the equal
- 33 protection of laws in violation of the Fourteenth Amendment to the United
- 34 States Constitution; that amending state laws would grant unborn children
- 35 protections that they do not currently possess in this state and would ensure
- 36 that they receive the equal protections of laws in this state; and that this

1	act is immediately necessary to provide equal protection to unborn children				
2	and to comply with the United States Constitution. Therefore, an emergency is				
3	declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the				
4	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective				
5	<u>on:</u>				
6	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;				
7	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,				
8	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the				
9	bill; or				
10	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is				
11	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
