1	(2)(A) A student with a disability as described by subdivision
2	(a)(3)(A)(i)(a) who has an annual family income that is less than or equal to
3	two hundred percent (200%) of the federal poverty guidelines as determined
4	annually in the Federal Register by the United States Department of Health
5	and Human Services under 42 U.S.C. § 9902(2), as required under the
6	Philanthropic Investment in Arkansas Kids Program may receive funds from both
7	the Arkansas Children's Educational Freedom Account Program established by
8	this subchapter and the Philanthropic Investment in Arkansas Kids Program.
9	(B) However, a student who qualifies under subdivision
10	(e)(2)(A) of this section may receive funds from both the Arkansas Children's
11	Educational Freedom Account Program established by this subchapter and the
12	Philanthropic Investment in Arkansas Kids Program only to the extent
13	necessary to cover qualifying expenses.
14	
15	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
16	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the provision of educational
17	services to children in the State of Arkansas impacts the public peace,
18	health, and safety through its effect upon student learning, which is
19	critical for the future success of the state; that educational services for
20	children with disabilities is essential for purposes of helping those
21	children with disabilities reach their full potential; that the State of
22	$\underline{\text{Arkansas has made extensive amendments to the Arkansas Code as it pertains to}}$
23	education, which will require new rules and procedures to be put in place
24	before the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year; and that this act is
25	immediately necessary because to give the Department of Education time to
26	promulgate rules that are necessary to implement this act in sync with the
27	other changes to the Arkansas Code and to allow time for families with low
28	incomes to plan for the educational placement of their children with
29	disabilities. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act
30	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health,
31	and safety shall become effective on:
32	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
33	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
34	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
35	bill; or
36	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is

1	<u>overridden,</u>	the	date	the	last	house	overrides	the	veto.
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
