8	(E) Multischool, multidistrict, and regional planning to
9	achieve the most effective and efficient instructional delivery system;
10	(F) Reasonable travel time and practical means of
11	addressing other demographic considerations; and
12	(G) Regularly scheduled maintenance, repair, and
13	renovation;
14	(3) How the new construction project supports the prudent and
15	resourceful expenditure of state funds and improves the school district's
16	ability to deliver an adequate and equitable education to public school
17	students in the district;
18	(4) How the new construction project has been prioritized by the
19	school district; and
20	(5) The allocation and expenditure of funds in accordance with
21	this subchapter and the Arkansas Public School Academic Facility Program Act,
22	<u>§ 6-21-801 et seq.</u>
23	(d)(1) State financial participation under the academic facilities
24	partnership program is not available until July 1, 2006. The division shall
25	give priority in state financial participation to school district proposals
26	relating to academic facilities with the highest facilities condition index.
27	(2)(A) With regard to an academic facilities project for which a
28	school district intends to apply for state financial participation during
29	fiscal year 2006-2007, the division shall notify the school district of the
30	division's decision on the application and, if applicable, the estimated
31	amount of state financial participation in the new construction project no
32	later than May 1, 2006.
33	(B) Beginning in 2007, the division shall notify the
34	school district of the division's decision on the application and, if
35	applicable, the estimated amount of state financial participation in the new
36	construction project no later than May 1 of each odd-numbered year.

1	(3) The division's notice of its decision on a school district's
2	application for state financial participation in a new construction shall
3	include an explanation of the evaluative factors underlying the decision of
4	the division to provide or not provide state financial participation in
5	support of the new construction project.
6	(e)(1) If the division determines that the new construction project is
7	eligible for state financial participation, the division and the school
8	district shall enter into an agreement specifying the terms of the state's
9	financial participation and the conditions that must be satisfied by the
10	school district.
11	(2) At a minimum, the agreement shall:
12	(A) Identify the estimated amount of local financial
13	participation and state financial participation in the new construction
14	project;
15	(B) Define the method of and schedule for transferring
16	state financial participation funds to the school district;
17	(C) Identify whether the new construction project includes
18	any improvements that are classified as maintenance, repair, and renovation,
19	and how the project costs will be allocated between new construction
20	activities and maintenance, repair, and renovation activities;
21	(D) Provide that changes to the plans for the new
22	construction project shall be made in consultation with the division;
23	(E) Provide that the division or any person acting on
24	behalf of the division may conduct on-site inspections of the new
25	construction project as frequently as the division deems necessary to assure
26	the prudent and resourceful expenditure of state funds with regard to public
27	school academic facilities;
28	(F) Determine how risk will be allocated between the
29	school district and the state if the new construction project is not
30	<pre>completed;</pre>
31	(G) Describe how changes in the school district's wealth
32	index over the course of the new construction project will be treated; and
33	(H) Specify that the agreement is void and the state will
34	have no further obligation to provide state funds to the school district for
35	the new construction project that is the subject of the agreement if the
36	school district does not raise local resources and apply local resources

1	toward the new construction project as provided under the agreement.
2	(f)(1) If a school district qualifies for state financial
3	participation under this section, the division shall certify the amount of
4	state financial participation to the Commission on Public School Academic
5	Facilities and Transportation for oversight purposes. The commission shall
6	certify the amount to the Department of Education for payment.
7	(2) For tracking purposes, the school district shall account for
8	the funds received as state financial participation under this section as
9	restricted funds and shall account for the funds in accordance with

14	6-20-2509. Academic Facilities Catastrophic Program.
15	(a) There is established the Academic Facilities Catastrophic Program
16	under which the Division of Public School Academic Facilities and
17	Transportation shall award state financial participation to a school district
18	based on a school district's academic facilities wealth index for eligible
19	catastrophic repair and new construction projects for the purpose of
20	supplementing insurance or other public or private emergency assistance
21	received by or payable to the school district.
22	(b) A school district may apply for state financial participation in a
23	catastrophic project if an academic facility in the district is damaged due

28	evidence of:

32	(3) How the catastrophic project supports the prudent and
33	resourceful expenditure of state funds and improves the school district's
34	ability to deliver an adequate and equitable education to public school
35	students in the district.
36	(d)(l) The division shall evaluate a school district's application for

1	catastrophic assistance and may conduct an on-site inspection prior to making
2	a decision on the application as it deems necessary.
3	(2) The division shall notify the school district of the
4	division's decision on the application and, if applicable, the amount of
5	state financial participation. The division shall base its decision, on
6	several factors, including, without limitation:
7	(A) Compliance with appropriate academic facility
8	standards, including, without limitation, appropriate space utilization;
9	(B) The amount and availability of insurance or other
10	public or private emergency assistance;
11	(C) The academic facilities wealth index of the school
12	district; and
13	(D) The prudent and resourceful expenditure of state funds
14	with regard to public school academic facilities.
15	(e)(1) If a school district qualifies for state financial
16	participation under this section, the division shall certify the amount of
17	state financial participation to the Commission on Public School Academic
18	Facilities and Transportation for oversight purposes. The commission shall
19	certify the amount to the Department of Education for payment.
20	(2) For tracking purposes, the school district shall account for
21	the funds received as state financial participation under this section as
22	restricted funds and shall account for the funds in accordance with
23	provisions of law, including without limitation, the Arkansas Educational
24	Financial Accounting and Reporting Act of 2005, § 6-20-2201 et seq. and rules

26	(f) Every effort shall be made to conform a catastrophic project to
27	current academic facilities standards, including appropriate space

30	(g) A school district shall use state financial participation in a
31	catastrophic program to pay the cost of only the portion of a catastrophic
32	project that is not covered by insurance or other public or private emergency
33	assistance received by or payable to the school district.
34	
35	6-20-2510. Project cost guidelines.
36	(a)(1) The Division of Public School Academic Facilities and

1	Transportation shall establish formulas that shall be updated annually for
2	determining the basic project cost per student for various types of new
3	construction projects, including, without limitation:
4	(A) New academic facilities;
5	(B) Additions to existing academic facilities; and
6	(C) Major improvements to academic facilities that bring
7	the state of condition or efficiency of the academic facility to a state of
8	condition or efficiency better than the facility's original condition of

25	cost. The division shall determine the estimated amount of the state's share
26	of financial participation based on the adjusted project cost and the school
27	district's wealth index as determined under § 6-20-2502.
28	
29	6-20-2511. Incentives for collaboration.
30	(a) It is the intent of the General Assembly to encourage school
31	districts to explore and consider arrangements with other districts that have
32	the potential to:
33	(1) Improve academic facilities and equipment available to the
34	public school students in the districts;
35	(2) Result in improved transportation arrangements for public
36	<u>school students in the state;</u>

1	(3) Have the potential to create any type of efficiency for
2	school districts or enhanced learning opportunities for public school
3	students in the state; and
4	(4) Facilitate the highest and best use of state funds in
5	support of public school academic facilities.
6	(b) If school districts voluntarily consolidate or if one (1) school

18	(a) The Division of Public School Academic Facilities and
19	Transportation shall develop a program to provide state financial
20	participation in the form of emergency loans to eligible high-growth school
21	districts for assistance with excess debt service requirements. The amount
22	of an emergency loan shall be based on:
23	(1) Growth trends in the district;
24	(2) The application of space utilization standards in the

30	(13) "Statewide average daily membership" means the total
31	number of days attended plus the total number of days absent by all students
32	in grades kindergarten through twelve (K-12) in all school districts during

34	average daily membership and rounded up to the nearest hundredth. Students
35	who may be counted for average daily membership are:
36	(A) Students who reside in Arkansas and who are

14	6-20-2404. Debt service funding supplement.
15	(a)(1) Beginning with school year 2004-2005, the state shall provide
16	to qualified school districts from available line item funds a debt service
17	funding supplement for the purpose of reducing bonded indebtedness if the
18	qualified school district elects to receive the funds in accordance with § 6-
19	<del>20-2407.</del>
20	(2)(A) A school district's debt service funding supplement is
21	calculated by multiplying the district's eligible debt service millage
22	required times an amount established annually by the State Board of
23	Education, but no less than twelve dollars (\$12.00) per average daily
24	membership times the state wealth index.
25	(B) The debt service funding supplement shall be
26	distributed quarterly.
27	(b) A school district qualifying for a debt service funding

16	millage incentive funding and is also eligible to receive a debt service
17	funding supplement or general facilities funding, or both, then the school

19	(4) A school district shall not receive supplemental millage
20	incentive funding along with a debt service funding supplement or general
21	facilities funding, or both.
22	(d) Supplemental millage incentive funding shall be distributed
23	<del>quarterly.</del>

25	6-20-2407. Funding election.
26	(a) By July 31 immediately preceding the school year, a school
27	district that is eligible for supplemental millage incentive funding shall
28	<del>provide the Department of Education with a written election indicating</del>

6	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
7	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Supreme Court has
8	determined that current public school academic facilities in Arkansas are
9	inadequate and inequitable; that the General Assembly established the Joint
10	Committee on Educational Facilities to inventory the current condition of
11	public school academic facilities and recommend methods for bringing public
12	school academic facilities into conformity with the court's constitutional
13	expectations; that the programs established in this act are derived from
14	recommendations of the joint committee and are part of a comprehensive
15	program for overseeing the provision of constitutionally appropriate public
16	school academic facilities across the state; that this program must be
17	implemented immediately for the good of public school students in Arkansas.
18	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately
19	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety,
20	Section 2 and Section 3 of this act shall be effective on July 1, 2005, and
21	Section 1 of this act shall become effective on:
22	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
23	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
24	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
25	<u>bill; or</u>
26	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
27	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
