34	(a) Residential care f	acilities and the State	of Arkansas face special
35	problems when caring for the	mentally ill. The chairs	s of the House Interim
36	Committees on Public Health,	Welfare, and Labor and t	the Senate Interim



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1 Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor shall establish a task force 2 with equal representation from residential care facilities, community mental 3 health centers, advocates for the mentally ill, and the Division of Mental 4 Health and the Division of Medical Services. The task force shall also 5 include at least one (1) member each from the Senate and House Committees on 6 Public Health, Welfare, and Labor. 7 (b) The task force shall present a proposal at the 2001 legislative 8 session for establishment and maintenance of a residential program designed 9 to address the unique needs of the mentally ill. The task force's 10 recommendations shall include adequate safeguards for residents, 11 reimbursement for residential care facilities, and financing opportunities 12 that will encourage and enable residential care facilities to build smaller, 13 more home-like settings for the care of the mentally ill. 14 15 SECTION 3. 21	20-76-503. Arkansas Rx Program — Established.
22	(a) Subject to the available funding, the Arkansas Rx Program is
23	established to reduce prescription drug prices and to improve the quality of
24	health care for residents of the state.
25	(b)(1) Subject to the available funding, the Department of Human
26	Services shall administer the program.
27	(2) The department shall use manufacturer rebates and pharmacy
28	discounts to reduce prescription drug prices.
29	(c) The department shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions
30	of this chapter.
31	(d) The department shall seek any waivers of federal law, rule, or
32	regulation necessary to implement the provisions of this subchapter.
33	
34	20-76-504. Rebate agreement.
35	
55	(a) Every drug manufacturer or labeler that sells prescription drugs

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1	program shall enter into a rebate agreement with the Department of Human
2	Services for participation in the Arkansas Rx Program.
3	(b) The rebate agreement shall require the manufacturer or labeler to
4	make rebate payments to the state each calendar quarter or according to a
5	schedule established by the department.
6	(c)(l) A penalty of ten percent (10%) of the total rebate amount shall
7	be assessed for any rebate not paid by the manufacturer or labeler in
8	accordance with subsection (b) of this section or pursuant to terms
9	established by the Director of the Department of Human Services.
10	(2) An additional penalty of five percent (5%) of the total
11	delinquent amount shall be assessed each quarter that delinquent rebates
12	remain unpaid to the state.
13	(d) The director or his or her designee may file suit in Pulaski
14	County Circuit Court to enforce rebate agreements and to collect delinquent
15	rebates and penalties.
16	
17	20-76-505. Rebate amount.
18	(a) The Director of the Department of Human Services shall negotiate
19	the amount of the rebate required from a manufacturer or labeler in
20	accordance with this section.
21	(b) The director shall take into consideration:
22	(1) The rebate calculated under the Medicaid rebate program
23	under 42 U.S.C. § 1396r-8;
24	(2) The average wholesale price of prescription drugs; and
25	(3) Any other available information on prescription drug prices
26	and price discounts.
27	(c) The director shall use his or her best efforts to obtain an
28	initial rebate amount equal to or greater than the rebate calculated under
29	the Medicaid rebate program under 42 U.S.C. § 1396r-8.
30	(d) To assist with the rebate program under this subchapter, the
31	director shall use his or her best efforts to obtain a rebate equal to or
32	greater than the amount of price reduction for prescription drugs provided to
33	the United States Government.
34	
35	20-76-506. Discounted prices for qualified residents.
36	Each participating retail pharmacy shall sell covered drugs to

1	qualified residents at the ordinary and customary retail price less any
2	applicable rebate established under this subchapter.
3	
4	20-76-507. Operation of program.
5	(a) Participating retail pharmacies shall disclose to qualified
6	residents the amount of savings provided as a result of the Arkansas Rx
7	Program.
8	(b) The Department of Human Services may not impose transaction
9	charges under the program on participating retail pharmacies that submit
10	elaims or receive payments under the program.
11	(c) A participating retail pharmacy shall submit claims to the
12	department in order to determine the appropriate rebates.
13	(d) On a biweekly basis, the department shall reimburse a
14	participating retail pharmacy for the applicable rebate provided to qualified
15	residents under § 20-76-506.
16	(e) The department shall conduct ongoing quality assurance activities
17	as needed at the discretion of the Director of Department of Human Services.
18	
19	20-76-508. Release of names of manufacturers and labelers.
20	(a) The names of manufacturers and labelers are public information
21	without regard to whether they enter into rebate agreements under this
22	subchapter.
23	(b) The Department of Human Services shall:
24	(1) Release the names of manufacturers and labelers to health
25	care providers and the public on a regular basis; and
26	(2) Publicize participation by manufacturers and labelers that
27	is of particular benefit to the public.
28	
29	20-76-509. Arkansas Rx Program Fund.
30	(a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, the
31	Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a special revenue
32	fund to be known as the "Arkansas Rx Program Fund".
33	(b)(1) All moneys collected under the Arkansas Rx Program shall be
34	deposited into the State Treasury to the credit of the fund as special
35	revenues.
36	(2) The fund shall also consist of any other revenues as may be

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1	authorized by law.
2	(c) The fund shall be used by the Department of Human Services to
3	reimburse:
4	(1) Retail pharmacies for rebates provided under this
5	subchapter; and
6	(2) The department for contracted services, including pharmacy
7	elaims processing fees, administrative and associated computer costs, and
8	other reasonable program costs.
9	(d) Surplus funds in the fund shall be used for the benefit of the
10	program.
11	
12	20-76-510. Annual summary report.
13	The Department of Human Services shall report the enrollment and
14	financial status of the Arkansas Rx Program to the Legislative Council by
15	October 1 each year.
16	
17	20-76-511. Obligations of Department of Human Services.
18	(a) The Department of Human Services shall:
19	(1) Establish simplified procedures for determining eligibility
20	and issuing Arkansas Rx Program enrollment cards to qualified residents; and
21	(2) Undertake outreach efforts to:
22	(A) Build public awareness of the program; and
23	(B) Maximize enrollment of qualified residents.
24	(b) The department may adjust the requirements and terms of the
25	program to accommodate any new federally funded prescription drug programs.
26	
27	20-76-512. Coordination of programs.
28	(a) The Department of Human Services shall administer the Arkansas Rx
29	Program in a manner that is advantageous to the program and to the enrollees
30	in the program.
31	(b) In implementing this subchapter, the department may:
32	(1) Coordinate other programs of the department with this
33	program; and
34	(2) Provide the benefits of this program to enrollees in other
35	programs of the department.
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1	20-76-513. Rules.
2	The Department of Human Services may promulgate such reasonable rules
3	as may be necessary or beneficial to the Arkansas Rx Program.
4	
5	20-76-514. Implementation.
6	The Department of Human Services shall begin offering Arkansas Rx
7	Program drug benefits under this subchapter on February 1, 2006, and shall
8	immediately make all best efforts to:
9	(1) Enroll eligible participants;
10	(2) Publicize and promote the program;
11	(3) Negotiate rebates with manufacturers;
12	(4) Enroll participating pharmacies; and
13	(5) Promulgate all rules necessary to administer the program.
14	
15	20-76-515. Fee.
16	Participating residents shall pay a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)
17	annually in order to participate in the Arkansas Rx Program.
18	
19	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 20-81-110, concerning a program for the
20	benefit of World War I veterans, is repealed.
21	20-81-110. Official flower — Poppy.
22	(a) The poppy is designated the official flower of World War veterans.
23	(b) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation,
24	association, or organization, except patriotic organizations chartered by
25	authority of a special act of Congress and the auxiliaries of such
26	organizations, to sell artificial poppies other than within a regular
27	established place of business. This exclusive authority is granted on the
28	condition that all profits accruing therefrom shall be expended on disabled
29	veterans of the World War and their dependents.
30	(c) Whoever shall violate any provisions of this section shall be
31	fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than fifty dollars
32	(\$50.00).
33	
34	SECTION 7. DO NOT CODIFY. The enactment and adoption of this act
35	shall not repeal, expressly or impliedly, the acts passed at the regular
36	session of the Eighty-Ninth General Assembly. All such acts shall have full

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1	force and effect, and so far as those acts intentionally vary from or
2	conflict with any provision contained in this act, those acts shall have the
3	effect of subsequent acts amending or repealing the appropriate parts of the
4	Arkansas Code of 1987.
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
