<u>HB1824</u>	A. Collins	TO AMEND THE LAW CONCERNING RECORDERS; AND TO AMEND THE LAW CONCERNING THE UNIFORM FEE FOR RECORDING INSTRUMENTS.
<u>HB1834</u>	Penzo	TO AMEND THE ARKANSAS TIME-SHARE ACT.

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
