CLASS SIZE AND TEACHING LOAD

1.00 REGULATORY AUTHORITY

1.01 These rules shall be known as the Arkansas Department of Education Rules Governing Class Size and Teaching Load.

1.02 The State Board of Education enacted these rules pursuant to its authority as set forth in Ark. Code Ann. § 6-11-105, § 25-15-201 et seq., and Act 243 of 2018.

2.00 DEFINITIONS

2.01 “Large group instruction” are those courses that accommodate larger numbers of students. The following courses are considered large group instruction:

2.01.1 Athletics, including when taken for physical education credit, and Grades 7-12 physical education;

2.01.2 Performing Arts, including, but not limited to, band, choir, and theater;

2.01.3 Junior Reserve Officer’s Training Corps (JROTC);

2.01.4 Non-academic activity, including, but not limited to, advisory periods, study hall, and student activity periods; or

2.01.5 Other courses identified as large group instruction in the Course Code Management System.

3.00 CLASS SIZE

3.01 Subject to any exceptions in Section 3.02, each school district and open-enrollment charter school shall comply with the following class sizes:

3.01.1 For Kindergarten (K), there shall be no more than twenty (20) students per teacher in any classroom. However, the kindergarten class maximum may be no more than twenty-two (22) with a one half-time instructional aide being employed for those classes.

3.01.2 For Grades One through Three (1-3), the average student/teacher ratio in a school district shall be no more than twenty-three (23) students per teacher in a classroom. There shall be no more than twenty-five (25) students per teacher in any classroom.

3.01.3 For Grade Four (4), the average student/teacher ratio in a school district shall be no more than twenty-five (25) students per teacher in a classroom. There shall be no more than twenty-eight (28) students per teacher in any classroom.

3.01.4 For Grades Five through Six (5-6), except for those courses that lend themselves to large group instruction, the average student/teacher ratio in a school district shall be no more than twenty-five (25) students per teacher in a classroom. There shall be no more than twenty-eight (28) students per teacher in any classroom.

3.01.5 For Grades Seven through Twelve (7-12), except for those courses that lend themselves to large group instruction, individual classes shall not exceed thirty (30) students.

3.02 Exceptions

3.02.1 Physical Education Instruction in Grades Kindergarten Through Six (K-6): Physical education classes will have a maximum student to adult ratio of thirty to one (30:1). Non-licensed personnel may assist in filling the thirty to one (30:1) student to adult ratio requirement if they are trained and assigned to assist licensed personnel in supervising physical education classes.

4.00 TEACHING LOAD

4.01 Except when a teacher teaches a course that lends itself to large group instruction, the maximum number of students a teacher in Grades Five through Twelve (5-12) is permitted to teach without receiving additional compensation shall not exceed one hundred fifty (150) students per day.

4.02 For purposes of Section 4.01, the teaching load shall be calculated by counting the number of students in each course and section except for those teachers in Grades 5-6 who are teaching all or most subjects in a self-contained elementary model.

4.03 Additional compensation shall be determined in accordance with Ark. Code Ann. § 6-17-812.

4.03.1 School districts shall adopt a policy to implement Section 4.03.

4.04 This Section does not apply to a public school that operates primarily as a virtual school.

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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - GRANTS AND AID TO LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND
SPECIAL PROGRAMS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of
Education, to be payable from the Department of Education Public School Fund
Account, for grants and aid to local school districts and special programs of
the Department of Education for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, the

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4 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. R.I.S.E.
 6 ARKANSAS - CARRY FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of monies allocated for
 7 R.I.S.E. Arkansas remaining on June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019, in the Department of
 8 Education Public School Fund Account shall be designated and retained for the
 9 R.I.S.E. Arkansas. Any carry forward of unexpected balance of funding as
 10 authorized herein, may be carried forward under the following conditions:

11 (1) Prior to June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019 the Agency shall by written statement
 12 set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the
 13 Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

14 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall
 15 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee all
 16 amounts carried forward by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or
 17 Joint Budget Committee meeting which report shall include the name of the
 18 Agency, Board, Commission or Institution and the amount of the funding
 19 carried forward, the program name or line item, the funding source of that
 20 appropriation and a copy of the written request set forth in item (1) above;

21 (3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a
 22 written report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
 23 containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written
 24 statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose, etc.
 25 for which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty
 26 (30) days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution
 27 presents its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget
 28 Committee; and

29 (4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall
 30 include all information obtained in item (3) above in the budget manuals
 31 and/or a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or
 32 Institution.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~
 34 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

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36 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
2 ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in the
3 Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and Special Programs section of this
4 Act may be fully funded. Any funding and appropriation for Isolated Funding
5 that is not utilized shall be transferred to the appropriation for Special
6 Needs Isolated Funding in the Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and
7 Special Programs section of this Act and shall be used there for fully
8 funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code §6-20-604 on a pro
9 rata basis until the available funds are exhausted. Pro rata basis is defined
10 as providing each district qualifying for additional funding under
11 subsections (c) through (f) a proportionate share based on how each
12 district's additional funding amount bears to the total additional funding
13 amounts for all qualifying districts. If any funding and appropriation
14 remains after funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code §6-20-
15 604 the remaining balance shall be used to fund the provisions of Arkansas
16 Code §6-20-604 (h) on an equal basis until the available funds are exhausted.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~
18 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

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20 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO
22 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School
23 Districts appropriation in the Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and
24 Special Programs section of this Act, "school district" means a school
25 district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state for the
26 education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district because
27 the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is completely
28 separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir covering
29 at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend school in
30 their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to travel or
31 to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or road route)
32 of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school district or
33 districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the monies
34 appropriated for Grants to School Districts in the Grants and Aid to Local
35 School Districts and Special Programs section of this Act to such school
36 districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating the pupils

1 residing in the separated portion of the school district. The payments are to
2 be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such school districts
3 shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department of Education and
4 provide the Department of Education with such documentation as is deemed
5 necessary.

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017
7 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

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9 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
10 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL
11 EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special
12 Education Services" in the Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and
13 Special Programs section of this Act shall be used to provide extended year
14 summer programs for handicapped students in need of such services, to provide
15 special education services to foster children who are wards of the State, and
16 to provide funds for the payment of salaries of special education
17 supervisors. The Department of Education shall distribute such funds in the
18 manner necessary to carry out the intent of this Section.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017
20 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

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22 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
24 DESEGREGATION EXPENSES. (A) For the fiscal year ending June 30, and for each
25 fiscal year thereafter, the Department of Education shall from time to time
26 as needed, certify to the State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
27 State, the amount of funds disbursed or approved to be disbursed by the
28 Department of Education for desegregation expenses under any "Desegregation
29 Settlement Agreement". Upon the receipt of such certification, the State
30 Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code 19-5-
31 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct from the net general revenues the amount
32 certified and transfer this amount to the Department of Education Public
33 School Fund Account there to be used exclusively for payment of or
34 reimbursement for expenses incurred from the Department of Education Public
35 School Fund Account under any "Desegregation Settlement Agreement".

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017

1 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

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3 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
5 CONSOLIDATION INCENTIVE. The appropriation contained herein for Consolidation
6 Incentive shall be allocated in accordance with rules and regulations
7 established by the State Board of Education.

8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~
9 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

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11 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
13 RESIDENTIAL CENTERS/JUVENILE DETENTION. The funds appropriated herein for
14 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with
15 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~
17 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

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19 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
21 AUTHORITY. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the approval
22 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the Arkansas
23 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to
24 request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related
25 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however,
26 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than
27 two transfer requests during any fiscal year.

28 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
29 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
30 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
31 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
32 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
33 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
34 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently
35 if some flexibility is provided to the Commissioner of the Department of
36 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision

1 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General
2 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative
3 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The
4 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
5 is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by
6 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional
7 by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~
9 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

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11 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AETN
13 DOCUMENTED QUIZ BOWL COSTS. Of the total amount of appropriation and funds
14 authorized herein to the Department of Education for the Quiz Bowl each
15 fiscal year, an amount not to exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) each
16 fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -
17 Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the
18 Quiz Bowl.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~
20 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

21 primarily as a virtual school.

22 (d) A school district shall adopt a policy to implement this section.

23 (e)(1) The department shall promulgate rules to implement this
24 section.

25 (2) The rules promulgated by the department shall include
26 without limitation the manner in which students in grades five (5) and six
27 (6) are to be counted for the purposes of this section.

28
29 SECTION 34. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
30 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
31 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
32 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
33 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
34 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
35 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
36 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be

1 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

2

3 SECTION 35. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
4 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
5 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
6 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
7 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
8 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
9 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
10 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

12 SECTION 36. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act is effective on and after July 1,
13 2018.
