19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

21 SECTION 1. The purpose of this act is to amend the Revenue
22 Stabilization Law.

23
24 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 19-5-402 (a)(i) is amended to read as
25 follows:

26 19-5-402. Maximum allocations of revenues for fiscal year 2014-2015 and
27 thereafter.

28 (a)(i) The Treasurer of State shall first make monthly allocations in the
29 proportions set out in this subsection to the funds and fund accounts listed
30 below until there has been transferred a total of ~~four billion nine hundred~~
31 ~~sixty-five million three hundred eighty thousand two hundred twenty-six~~
32 ~~dollars (\$4,965,380,226)~~ four billion nine hundred seventy-one million five
33 hundred eighty-seven thousand four hundred seventy-five dollars
34 (\$4,971,587,475) or so much thereof as may become available; provided, that
35 the Treasurer of State shall make such monthly allocations in accordance with
36 each fund or fund account's proportionate part of the total of all such

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19 SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
 20 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that funds provided by the General
 21 Assembly for the operations of the Department of Correction have, due to
 22 unforeseen circumstances, become insufficient for the department to provide
 23 essential governmental services; that this act provides additional funds that
 24 are necessary for the department to provide essential governmental services;
 25 and that a delay in this act's effective date would work irreparable harm
 26 upon the proper administration of the department and the performance of its
 27 duties. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being
 28 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
 29 safety shall become effective on:

- 30 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
 31 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
 32 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
 33 bill; or
 34 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
 35 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
