

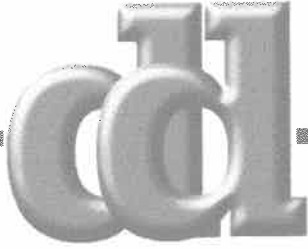

The Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act as amended (P. L. 106-402) authorizes Developmental Disabilities Councils to be established in every State and Territory. The Councils are given the direction and broad authority to set priorities in their individual State by the DD Act. Funds allotted to the State shall be used to pay for the federal share of the cost of carrying out projects in accordance with State Plans approved under the DD Act (Section 124) for the provision under such plans of services for individuals with developmental disabilities.

The Arkansas Governor's Developmental Disabilities Council (DDC) operates under the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act as amended (P. L. 106-402). The Council's main objective is to improve the independence and productivity of people with developmental disabilities and to ensure their integration and inclusion into the community. The DD Council consist of individuals with developmental disabilities, family members, directors of state agencies that serve people with disabilities and representatives from nonprofit and private organizations that provide services and supports for people with disabilities.
