

Thoroughbred Rule 2069 Amendment Summary

This amendment lowers the breath and urine sample alcohol testing levels for jockeys to 0.00%. The old Rule would have allowed jockeys to have up to 0.05% alcohol concentration in their system.

Thoroughbred Rule 2069 Mark Up

2069. The Stewards may at any time require any licensee having direct physical contact with horses or direct responsibility for some portion of the day's racing program, or whose duties place him or her in a position of danger, or who commits an act that endangers a horse or human to provide breath or urine samples for analysis. If a licensee declines to provide a sample, or if a sample shows a positive level of any nonprescription, prohibited or illegal drug, or an alcohol concentration greater than 0.05 % and 0.00% for jockeys. The Stewards may decline to license or may suspend any license theretofore granted to, and may exclude any such person for a period not exceeding the licensing year and may fine any such person any amount up to the maximum amount permitted by Arkansas law.
