8 AN ACT TO CREATE A STUDY OF THE USE OF CERTAIN
9 ELECTION TECHNOLOGY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Subtitle

12 TO CREATE A STUDY OF THE USE OF CERTAIN
13 ELECTION TECHNOLOGY.
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17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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19 SECTION 1. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. DO NOT CODIFY. Legislative study of
20 and report on the use of certain election technology – Purpose – Scope –
21 Requirements.

22 (a)(1) The House Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs
23 and the Senate Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs shall
24 meet jointly to conduct a study of election technology, including without
25 limitation the use of biometric data and ballot tracking.

26 (2) The Chair of the House Committee on State Agencies and
27 Governmental Affairs and the Chair of the Senate Committee on State Agencies
28 and Governmental Affairs may invite the House Committee on City, County, and
29 Local Affairs and the Senate Committee on City, County, and Local Affairs to
30 meet with the House Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs and
31 the Senate Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs for purposes
32 of the study required under this section.

33 (b)(1) The purpose of the study required under this section is to
34 study the possible use of certain election technology to increase
35 transparency and security.

36 (2) The study required under this section shall include without



1 limitation:

2 (A) An assessment of the potential use of biometric data
3 for elections, including without limitation the voluntary use of fingerprints
4 and facial recognition technology;

5 (B) An examination of the procedures and changes necessary
6 to allow for ballot tracking, including without limitation the voluntary use
7 of ballot numbers to allow voters to track their ballots and ensure their
8 votes are recorded correctly;

9 (C) An assessment of the potential use of mobile polling
10 stations; and

11 (D) Any other election technologies the House Committee on
12 State Agencies and Governmental Affairs and the Senate Committee on State
13 Agencies and Governmental Affairs determine should be studied to increase
14 election transparency and security.

15 (c) The Secretary of State shall assist the House Committee on State
16 Agencies and Governmental Affairs and the Senate Committee on State Agencies
17 and Governmental Affairs with any information needed to complete the study
18 required under this section.

19 (d) Joint meetings for purposes of conducting the study required under
20 this section shall be held at the call of the Chair of the House Committee on
21 State Agencies and Governmental Affairs and the Chair of the Senate Committee
22 on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs.

23 (e) On or before November 30, 2022, the House Committee on State
24 Agencies and Governmental Affairs and the Senate Committee on State Agencies
25 and Governmental Affairs shall submit to the Legislative Council a final
26 written report of their activities, findings, and recommendations with regard
27 to the study required under this section, including without limitation:

28 (1) Findings on the election technology the state should adopt
29 to increase transparency and security; and

30 (2) Recommended draft legislation to address the findings of the
31 study, including any recommended legislation.

32 (f) The study required under this section shall be complete upon
33 submission of the final written report to the Legislative Council required
34 under subsection (e) of this section.
