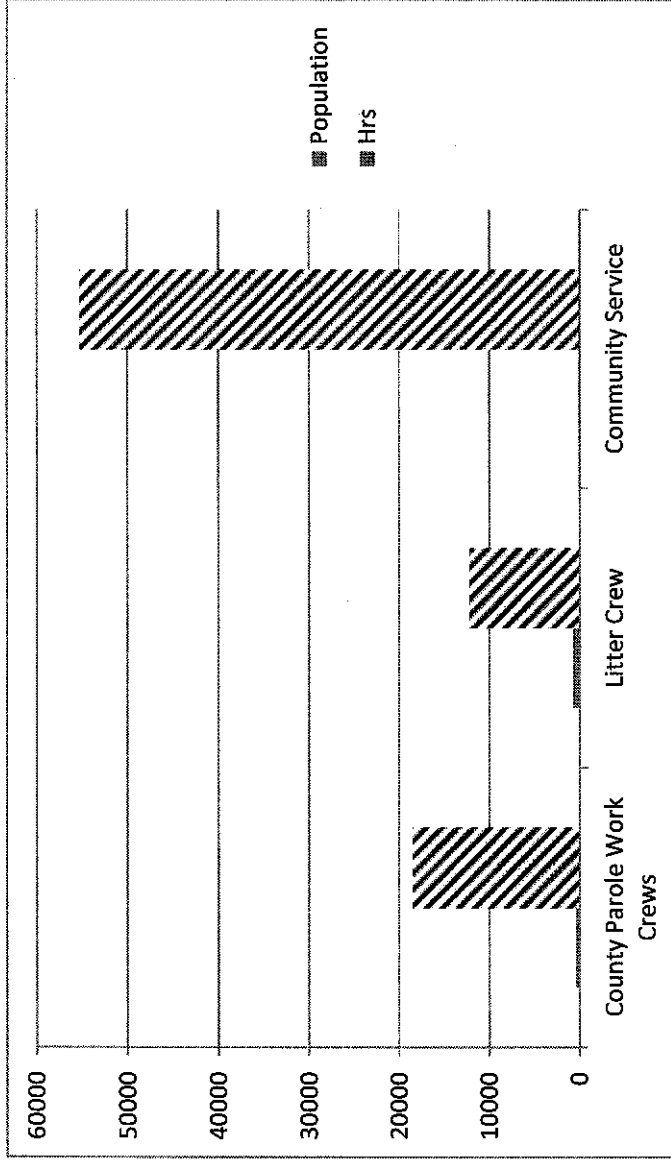


# Department of Community Corrections Community Service Hours – FY2013



**\*\*County Parole Work Crew; 463 Population - 18,520 Hours**  
**\*\*Litter Crew; 748 Population - 12,238 Hours**  
**\*\*Community Service Hour; Total 55,256**

**\*\* Offenders are either supervised by a DCC employee or a supervisor from an agency to which the worker is assigned. For example, the County Parole Work Crew is supervised by the Road Department in Benton County and other counties use the road department or another department within local government. The Highway Litter Crew is supervised either by a DCC officer or the Highway Department. Regular community service is either a result of a conversion in lieu of supervision fees that has been arranged by the supervision officer or by sanction from the Circuit Judge in a probation. These offenders are supervised by a DCC officer or a supervisor of a non-profit organization to which the offender has been assigned.**
