19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
20

21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 14-42-201(d) is amended to read as follows:

22 "(d) In addition to other residency requirements imposed by state law
23 for municipal office holders, candidates for the positions of mayor, clerk,
24 city attorney, recorder or treasurer must reside within the corporate
25 municipal limits at the time they file as a candidate and must continue to
26 reside within the corporate limits to retain elective office. In cities of the
27 first and second class, candidates for the position of alderman shall reside
28 within the corporate limits and their respective wards at the time they file
29 as a candidate for alderman and when holding that office. "
30

31 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
32 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
33 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
34

35 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
36 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect

1 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
2 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
3 act are declared to be severable.

5 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
6 hereby repealed.
