16 AN ACT FOR THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS IN
17 SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY AND AUDIOLOGY
18 APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2010-2011 FISCAL
19 YEAR.
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23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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25 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the Board of
26 Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology for the 2010-2011 fiscal
27 year, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall
28 be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation
29 Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws
30 amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific
31 maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the
32 provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons
33 occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions
34 of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-
35 101), or its successor.

SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology for the 2010-2011 fiscal year, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: one (1) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS - OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology, for personal services and operating expenses of the Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the following:

1 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

3 INVESTIGATOR. The Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and
 4 Audiology shall contract with an outside investigator, as needed, to perform
 5 investigations and conduct inspections of alleged wrongdoing. The duties of
 6 the investigator hired shall include, but not be limited to, investigation
 7 and inspection of all complaints as determined by the Board, to determine
 8 whether or not any persons have

9 (1) Practiced their profession in such a way as to endanger the general
 10 health and welfare of the public; or

11 (2) Otherwise violated the practice act or rules and regulations of the
 12 Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology Board.

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 14 SECTION 5. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
 15 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
 16 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
 17 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
 18 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
 19 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
 20 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
 21 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
 22 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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 24 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
 25 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
 26 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
 27 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
 28 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
 29 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
 30 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
 31 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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 33 SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
 34 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
 35 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
 36 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2010 is essential to the operation of

1 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
2 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
3 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2010 could work irreparable harm
4 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
5 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
6 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
7 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2010.
