Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill No. 646.

Amend Senate Bill No. 646 as originally introduced:

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Page 2, delete lines 34 through 36 in their entirety

AND

Page 3, line 1, delete "(8)" and substitute "(8)(7)"

AND

Page 3, line 3, delete "(9)" and substitute "(8)"

AND

Page 3, line 13, delete "(9)(10)" and substitute "(9)"

AND

Page 3, line 16, delete "(10)(11)" and substitute "(10)"

AND

Page 3, line 34 delete "(11)(12)" and substitute "(11)"

AND

Page 4, line 2 delete "(12)(13)" and substitute "(12)"

AND
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Page 4, line 4 delete "(13)" and substitute "(13)"

AND

Page 4, delete lines 17 and 18 and substitute the following: "resolution was received by the department project plan was approved by the department.

(14) "Project plan" means the plan submitted to the department containing such information as may be required by the director to determine eligibility for benefits;"

AND

Page 5, line 28 add the following SECTION:

"SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly that this act is designed to bring new jobs to this state; that current financial conditions dictate that unless industries can take advantage of the provisions of this act immediately they may forced to locate in another state; that unless this bill takes effect immediately significant numbers of jobs will be lost to this state. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto."
